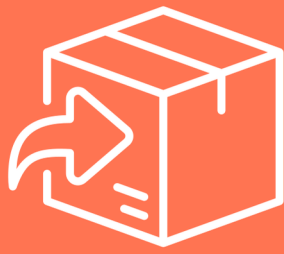

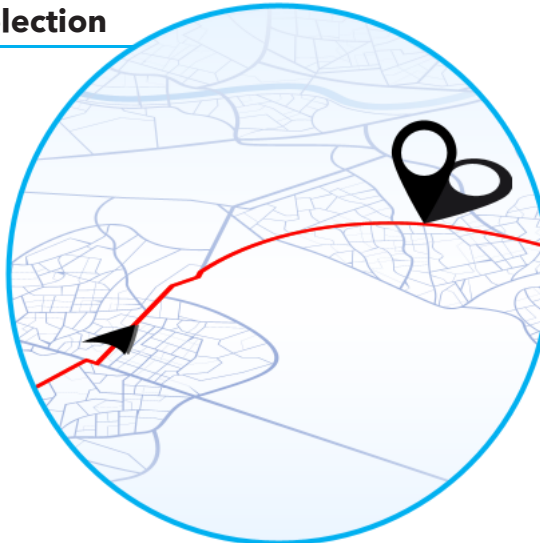

# Driving

## JourneyPlans

Before departure, ensure:

- The vehicle is fit for purpose
- shipping documentation is accessible
- the load secure and not damaged
- You know the route to be taken
- You are rested and fit to drive
- You are briefed on current safety and security concerns
- emergency equipment is readily accessible

# Stops and Breaks

## Planning

- Stops and breaks along a route should be planned
- Each stop should be assessed to determine suitability
- Consider whether any sites have a history of accidents or security breaches.

## Reducing Error and Improving Performance

- Plan stops along routes taking into account reasonable driving durations and select route segments that comply with regulations on driving shift times

## Emergency Response

- Plan what to do should a vehicle be diverted or need an unplanned stop
- Develop a notification process for identifying unplanned stops
- Train drivers on how to respond to potential safety or security incidents

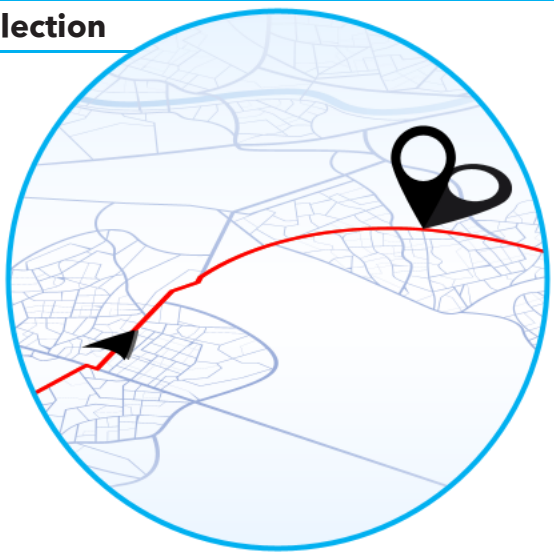

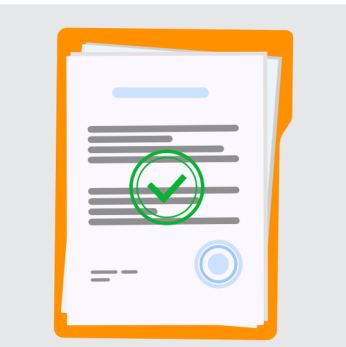


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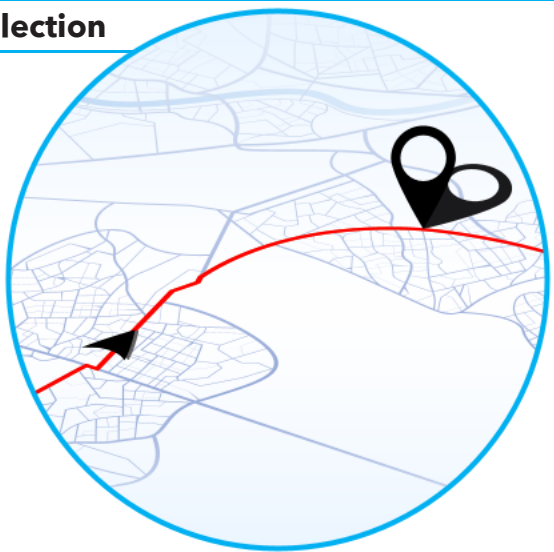
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
