- 6.2 Further to a decision by the Council at its Sixty-Seventh Session (EC-67/DEC.6, dated 15 February 2012), the Council is **requested** to consider and note a report by the Director-General on the overall progress of the destruction of abandoned chemical weapons (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations).

- 6.6 Further to a decision by the Council at its Sixty-Seventh Session (EC-67/DEC.6) and the destruction plan beyond the year 2016 for the chemical weapons abandoned by Japan in China (EC-84/NAT.6, dated 2 March 2017) attached as Annex 2 to Council decision EC-67/DEC.6, and adopted by the Council at its Eighty-Fourth Session (paragraph 6.14 of EC-84/2, dated 9 March 2017), a national paper by China (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations) and a national paper by Japan (EC-88/NAT.2, dated 18 June 2018) on the overall progress of the destruction of chemical weapons abandoned by Japan on the territory of China have been circulated to the members of the Council.

#### Subitem 6(c): Elimination of the Syrian chemical weapons programme

- 6.7 Further to its decision at its Eighty-Third Session (EC-83/DEC.5, dated 11 November 2016), the Council decided to place "Elimination of the Syrian Chemical Weapons Programme" on the agenda of all future Council sessions until the Council determines that all elements of the Syrian chemical weapons programme have been eliminated.
- 6.8 The Council is **requested** to note Notes by the Director-General reporting on progress in the elimination of the Syrian chemical weapons programme (EC-88/DG.1, dated 23 March 2018; EC-88/DG.3, dated 24 April 2018; EC-88/DG.8, dated 24 May 2018; and EC-88/DG.16, dated 22 June 2018).
- 6.9 The Council is **requested** to note the national papers by the Syrian Arab Republic on the activities related to the destruction of Syrian chemical weapons and their production facilities (EC-88/P/NAT.1, dated 21 March 2018; EC-88/P/NAT.2, dated 18 April 2018; EC-88/P/NAT.3, dated 22 May 2018; and EC-88/P/NAT.4, dated 20 June 2018).
- 6.10 Pursuant to decision EC-83/DEC.5, the Director-General shall report to the Council at all future sessions. The Council is **requested** to note a report by the Director-General entitled "Status of Implementation of Executive Council Decision EC-83/DEC.5 (dated 11 November 2016)" (EC-88/DG.13, dated 14 June 2018).
- 6.11 The Council is **requested** to note a Note by the Director-General entitled "Report on the Work of the Declaration Assessment Team" (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations).

- 6.16 The Secretariat has submitted to the Council a Note on amendments to the facility agreement with Slovakia regarding on-site inspections at a Schedule 1 facility for protective purposes (EC-88/S/2, dated 30 May 2018).
- 6.17 Proposed amendments to the aforementioned facility agreement have been submitted separately to the Council, which is **requested** to consider and approve them (EC-88/DEC/CRP.2 and EC-88/P/DEC/CRP.2, both dated 30 May 2018).
- 6.18 The Secretariat has also submitted a Note on modifications to the facility agreement with the United States of America regarding on-site inspections at the Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant Explosive Destruction System Chemical-Weapons Destruction Facility Pueblo, Colorado, the United States of America (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations).
