NOTE BY THE TECHNICAL SECRETARIAT

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR THE SUBREGIONAL SEMINAR ON CHEMICAL INDUSTRY-RELATED ISSUES FOR STATES PARTIES IN THE MEDITERRANEAN BASIN ISTANBUL, TURKEY 24 AND 25 SEPTEMBER 2009

- 1. On behalf of the Government of Turkey and the OPCW, the Director-General is pleased to invite National Authorities and chemical industries in the Mediterranean Basin to submit nominations for a subregional seminar on matters related to national implementation of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Convention") that are also of relevance to the chemical industry, to be held in Istanbul, Turkey, on 24 and 25 September 2009. Nominees from National Authorities should actually be involved in preparing declarations under Article VI of the Convention or in escorting OPCW inspection teams that carry out inspections under the said Article. Representatives of the chemical industry in different Member States should be nominated through their respective National Authorities.
- 2. The Second Special Session of the Conference of the States Parties to Review the Operation of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Second Review Conference") took place in The Hague in April 2008. During the review process of the operation of the verification regime of the Convention, several issues dealing with Article VI (declarations and inspections) were extensively discussed and the views of the States Parties were reflected in the final document adopted by the Second Review Conference (RC-2/4, dated 18 April 2008). The guidance provided by the Second Review Conference will be crucial for the operation of the verification regime, including Article VI-related issues, for the foreseeable future.
- 3. The number of Article VI declarations from the States Parties in the Mediterranean Basin can be expected to increase as a result of greater awareness about the Article VI declaration requirements. Subsequent to the adoption by the Conference of the States Parties of a recent decision on, inter alia, import-export terminology (C-13/DEC/CRP.1, dated 7 November 2008), this seminar will aim to sensitise States Parties to the new approach to be adopted in order to declare imports and exports of scheduled chemicals on the basis of this recent decision.

- 4. The objectives of the seminar are to:
 - (a) provide an opportunity for participating States Parties to consider and discuss specific chemical industry-related issues that have a direct bearing on the effective implementation of the Convention in light of the recommendations made by the Second Review Conference;
 - (b) contribute to information sharing on practical implementation-related issues arising from the decisions taken at the Second Review Conference;
 - (c) foster wider cooperation between States Parties in the Mediterranean Basin on chemical industry-related issues in order to achieve the objectives of the Convention and of subsequent decisions taken by the policy-making organs of the OPCW; and
 - (d) exchange experiences in receiving chemical-industry inspections, as well as in improving their efficiency.
- 5. Participants in the seminar will be expected to make presentations on the following topics:
 - (a) current practices in identifying activities declarable under Article VI of the Convention;
 - (b) current practices in gathering data on the import and export of scheduled chemicals; and
 - (c) experience gained in receiving inspections under Article VI of the Convention.
- 6. The provisional programme for the seminar is included as Annex 1 to this Note.
- 7. The Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat") expects to be able to sponsor the participation of one National Authority representative and one chemical industry representative from a limited number of States Parties. Industry representatives shall be nominated through their respective National Authorities in the Mediterranean The sponsorship of National Authority representatives shall be contingent upon the nomination and sponsorship of industry representatives of the relevant States Each nomination should specify whether sponsorship is a condition of the nominee's participation. For sponsored participants, the Secretariat will cover the costs of travel, meals, and medical insurance, and will provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover sundry expenses. The Secretariat will also arrange and pay for accommodation for sponsored participants. Sponsored participants who do not intend to use the accommodation arranged by the Secretariat are requested to indicate that as soon as possible, so that the Secretariat does not incur hotel cancellation fees. In any case, the Secretariat will not cover the costs of any accommodation that it has not arranged.
- 8. The nomination forms for the seminar are included as Annex 2 to this Note.

- 9. When making travel arrangements for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. It will purchase tickets and send them to participants. Participants will be allowed to purchase tickets locally only if this leads to further savings for the Secretariat and if the Secretariat authorises it. In order for the Secretariat to keep costs to a minimum, participants are expected to arrive no earlier than Wednesday, 23 September 2009, and to depart no later than Saturday, 26 September 2009. The Secretariat's agreement is required for any changes to the arrival and departure dates. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the seminar or resulting from changes to travel arrangements that it has not authorised. Sponsored participants shall bear all costs resulting from changes they make, including cancellations once the Secretariat has purchased tickets. Participants who have not been sponsored are requested to make their own travel and accommodation arrangements, although the Secretariat can, if necessary, arrange accommodation at reduced rates.
- 10. Participants are requested to obtain any necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to the seminar. When applying for any entry visa, they should present the Embassy or Consulate of Turkey with a copy of the acceptance letter from the OPCW.
- 11. The seminar will be conducted entirely in English. All participants are therefore expected to have a good written and oral command of that language.
- 12. Interested National Authorities are invited to complete the nomination form that is included as Annex 2 to this Note, making sure in particular to provide all the contact details it requests.
