## NOTE BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

### TWELFTH REGIONAL MEETING OF NATIONAL AUTHORITIES OF STATES PARTIES IN AFRICA UNITED NATIONS OFFICE AT NAIROBI NAIROBI, KENYA 4 – 6 JUNE 2014

- 1. On behalf of the Government of the Republic of Kenya and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW), the Director-General wishes to invite National Authorities to submit nominations for the Twelfth Regional Meeting of National Authorities of States Parties in Africa, which will be held at the United Nations Office at Nairobi, in Nairobi, Kenya, from 4 to 6 June 2014.
- 2. The Third Special Session of the Conference of the States Parties to Review the Operation of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Third Review Conference") encouraged States Parties which are yet to fulfil their obligations to engage with the Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat") on the steps that need to be undertaken for the national implementation of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Convention"). It highlighted the need for a comprehensive approach to national implementation in line with each State Party's constitutional requirements, to filling gaps in national implementation, and to ensuring that national implementation measures are consistent with the provisions of the Convention. It also encouraged the Secretariat to explore innovative methods of providing assistance on tailor-made approaches and develop, within existing resources, activities that will enhance South-South, regional, and subregional cooperation, as well as special programmes (RC-3/3\*, dated 19 April 2013).
- 3. While acknowledging the challenges still faced by certain States Parties, the Third Review Conference also noted the value of bilateral assistance and networking within and among regions, especially for States Parties that may need particular assistance. States Parties and the Secretariat were encouraged to continue to consult in order to enhance further the utility and effectiveness of all implementation-support programmes. States Parties in a position to do so were further urged to continue to enhance their practical support for the implementation of Article VII obligations.
- 4. The Third Review Conference additionally called upon the Secretariat to continue implementing the OPCW Programme to Strengthen Cooperation with Africa on the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Africa Programme") and to provide feedback on a regular basis on the activities and progress made in this regard. It

affirmed that the effective contribution of the Convention to international and regional peace and security can be enhanced through its full and effective implementation. It also acknowledged the role of education, outreach and awareness-raising as a relevant activity for the national implementation of the Convention.

- 5. The meeting will provide States Parties in the region with updates on the work of the OPCW and the implementation of the Convention. Participants are expected to attend and participate in the deliberations of at least two parallel sessions based on those aspects of national implementation which are considered priorities for their National Authorities.
- 6. During the meeting, representatives of participating National Authorities will be able to confer with each other, with the Secretariat staff and the resource persons to identify what further steps, if any, each State Party needs to take in order to implement fully its obligations under the Convention. This will enable the Secretariat, the African Union Commission, relevant subregional institutions in the region, and States Parties in a position to do so, to determine how to enhance the assistance provided to States Parties in the region.
- 7. States Parties in the region can also present their needs for assistance in relation to their obligations under the Convention. States Parties that are in a position to do so will be requested to indicate what type of assistance they can offer to others.
- 8. The provisional programme for the meeting is included as Annex 1 to this Note. The objectives of the meeting are:
  - (a) to provide updates on:
    - (i) the status of implementation of the provisions of the Convention;
    - (ii) recent developments within the OPCW;
    - (iii) recent developments in relation to Article VI and their impact on States Parties in Africa;
    - (iv) recent developments in relation to Article VII and their impact on States Parties in Africa; and
    - (v) the Africa Programme.
  - (b) to discuss and make recommendations on practical issues affecting the national implementation of States Parties' obligations under the Convention;
  - (c) to discuss and make recommendations on education, outreach and awareness-raising and the national implementation of the Convention;
  - (d) to review and share best practices regarding the implementation of provisions of the Convention; and
  - (e) to arrange bilateral meetings between National Authority representatives, Secretariat staff, and resource persons.
- 9. Nominees should be heads of National Authorities, focal points, or their representatives who are actually involved in the national implementation of the

Convention. Participants will be expected to make national contributions to the discussions on the areas mentioned above, focusing on:

- (a) the problems encountered and the support required to address them;
- (b) what offers of support the National Authority can provide to other National Authorities in the region and in which areas of expertise; and
- (c) the impact/result of activities in which nominees from the State Party have participated, especially those conducted under the auspices of the Africa Programme.
- 10. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor the participation of a limited number of representatives of National Authorities. Each nomination should specify whether sponsorship is a condition of the nominee's participation. For sponsored participants, the Secretariat will cover the costs of travel, meals, and medical insurance, and will provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover sundry expenses. The Secretariat will also arrange and pay for accommodation for sponsored participants. Sponsored participants who do not intend to use the accommodation arranged by the Secretariat are requested to indicate so as soon as possible, so that the Secretariat does not incur hotel cancellation fees. In no case will the Secretariat cover the costs of any accommodation it has not arranged.
- 11. When making travel arrangements for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. It will purchase tickets and send them to participants. Participants will be allowed to purchase tickets locally only if this leads to further savings for the Secretariat and if the Secretariat authorises it. In order for the Secretariat to keep costs to a minimum, participants are expected to arrive **no earlier than Tuesday, 3 June 2014** and to depart **no later than Saturday, 7 June 2014**. The Secretariat's agreement is required for any changes to the arrival and departure dates. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the meeting or that result from changes to travel arrangements that it has not authorised. Sponsored participants shall bear all costs resulting from changes they make, including cancellations, once the Secretariat has purchased tickets. Participants who have not been sponsored are requested to make their own arrangements for travel and accommodation, although the Secretariat can, if requested, arrange accommodation at reduced rates.
- 12. Participants are requested to obtain any necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to Kenya. When applying for any entry visa, they should present the Embassy or Consulate of Kenya with a copy of the acceptance letter from the OPCW. The Secretariat will issue a visa support letter to sponsored participants to facilitate the issuance of their visas.
- 13. All activities during the meeting will be conducted in English, with interpretation into French. All participants are therefore expected to have a good written and oral command of one of these two languages. Please be advised that participants must present an OPCW acceptance letter at the meeting in order to register.
- 14. Interested National Authorities are invited to complete the nomination form and the endorsement form that are attached to this Note (Annex 2), making sure they provide all the details requested. Completed forms should be addressed to the

Nominations may also be submitted by fax to +31 (0)70 416 3228, or by e-mail to ipb@opcw.org. All nominations must be received by the Secretariat **no later than 18 April 2014**. Due to the large number of applications expected, only candidates whose applications have been successful will be contacted. Nominations received by the Secretariat after the deadline will not be considered for sponsorship.
