NOTE BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR A TRAINING COURSE ON CONDUCTING SAMPLING AND ANALYSIS IN A HIGHLY CONTAMINATED ENVIRONMENT CZESTOCHOWA, POLAND 6 – 11 JUNE 2016

- 1. On behalf of the Government of Poland and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW), the Director-General wishes to invite Member States to nominate participants for a training course in conducting sampling and analysis in a highly contaminated environment, to be held in Czestochowa, Poland, from 6 to 11 June 2016.
- 2. The course will be jointly organised by the Government of Poland and the Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat"). The main purpose of the training is to provide expert knowledge and skills to 15 specialists from Member States, who would be responsible for conducting sampling and analysis tasks in a highly contaminated environment as a result of a chemical attack or a chemical incident.
- 3. Member States that do not yet have sampling and analysis capabilities are especially encouraged to nominate participants. Given the objectives of the course, and its technical nature, applicants should have a solid technical background in chemistry and the management of hazardous chemical substances. Participants must also be qualified and experienced in using and wearing self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA). Previous practical experience in military or civil protection is desirable. Individual protective suits will be worn for several hours each day, and participants must, therefore, be physically fit and able to wear such equipment for extended periods.
- 4. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor a limited number of participants from States Parties. Each nomination should specify whether sponsorship is a condition of the nominee's participation. The course materials, accommodation, meals, and local transport during the course will be provided by the National Authority of Poland. Further details regarding accommodation, the course venue, and transport will be issued to all confirmed participants at a later date.
- 5. When making travel arrangements for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. In order for the Secretariat to keep costs to a minimum, sponsored participants are expected to arrive no earlier than Sunday, 5 June 2016, and to depart no later than Sunday, 12 June 2016. The Secretariat's approval is required for any changes to the arrival and departure dates of sponsored participants. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the course or that result from

unauthorised changes to travel arrangements. Sponsored participants shall bear all costs resulting from changes they make, including cancellations, once the Secretariat has purchased their tickets.

- 6. Applicants are expected to be familiar with the principles of first response and chemical emergency management and will be carefully selected in line with the objective of the course and their stated area of expertise.
- 7. The course will be conducted in English, and no interpretation services of any kind will be provided. Participants are therefore expected to have a good command of both written and spoken English.
- 8. Applicants are invited to complete the nomination form that is included as Annex 2 to this Note, giving the nominee's full name, passport details, address, fax and telephone numbers, email address, and their areas of expertise, which should be relevant to the subject of the course. The completed nomination form, together with a brief curriculum vitae for each nominee, should be submitted to the Assistance and Protection Branch, by e-mail attachment to EmergAssistBr@opcw.org and Justo.QuinteroMendez@opcw.org. The subject line of the email should indicate "APB Czestochowa 2016". Nominations should be sent as soon as possible, but no later than 25 March 2016, to allow sufficient time for the Secretariat and the Polish authorities to make the necessary arrangements. Endorsement by the National Authority will be a condition for acceptance. Selected applicants should expect a notification by email around 15 April.
- 9. Participants are requested to obtain all necessary visas, including transit visas, before travelling to Poland. Please be aware that Schengen Area visas can take up to three weeks to obtain, so the visa request should be submitted well in advance.
- 10. The provisional programme for the course is included as Annex 1 to this Note; further details will be issued at a later date.
