NOTE BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR A BASIC COURSE ON ASSISTANCE AND PROTECTION ANKARA, TURKEY 30 MAY – 3 JUNE 2016

- 1. The Director-General of the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW) wishes to invite States Parties to nominate representatives to participate in a basic training course on assistance and protection, which will take place from 30 May to 3 June 2016 in Ankara, Turkey.
- 2. The course is being jointly organised by the Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat") and the Government of Turkey, and will provide training for up to 20 instructors who are involved in responding to chemical emergency incidents. The course will cover the following topics:
 - (a) protection of personnel during a chemical emergency;
 - (b) rescue and decontamination operations in contaminated areas; and
 - (c) appropriate responses and countermeasures in the event of incidents involving chemical-warfare agents or toxic chemicals.
- 3. The course will also provide an overview of the kinds of assistance the OPCW can provide, and will help participating States Parties to better equip instructors in their countries to propagate knowledge on the protection against chemical weapons and other toxic chemicals, as well as on how to manage chemical incidents.
- 4. The course will offer an introduction to the use of individual and collective protective equipment; to monitoring, detection, and decontamination; and to sampling techniques. It will also facilitate the exchange of information and experiences regarding the implementation of Article X of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Convention"), and provide a forum for States Parties to discuss how they can cooperate in the future and what further offers they might make to the OPCW under Article X. The course will include a field emergency response exercise.
- 5. Given the purpose of the course and its technical nature, candidates will be carefully selected according to the following criteria:
 - (a) All participants should be first responders and/or instructors/trainers, or be involved in developing an emergency response system in their own countries.

- (b) All participants must have a good oral and written command of English, as all activities during the course will be conducted in English and no interpretation services of any kind will be available.
- (c) Preference will be given to instructors from emergency response units, such as firefighters, emergency medical personnel, hazardous materials response personnel, and police officers.
- (d) Participants must be physically fit and capable of wearing individual protective gear for several hours at a time. Some practical experience with protective equipment is desirable.
- 6. Applications will be carefully screened on the basis of the criteria specified in paragraph 5 above. Only the most suitable applicants will be selected.
- 7. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor a limited number of participants from States Parties. For sponsored participants, it will cover the costs of accommodation and meals. Further details regarding accommodation, the course venue, and transport will be issued to all confirmed participants at a later date.
- 8. In order for the Secretariat to keep costs to a minimum, sponsored participants are expected to arrive no earlier than Sunday, 29 May 2016 and to depart no later than Saturday, 4 June 2016.
- 9. Sponsored participants must bear all costs not related to the course, or costs which result from any itinerary changes made without the explicit approval of the Secretariat. Participants who have not been sponsored are requested to make their own travel arrangements according to the dates indicated in paragraph 8 above. All participants are requested to obtain all necessary visas before travelling to Turkey.
- 10. Interested applicants are invited to complete the nomination form that is included as Annex 2 to this Note, making sure to provide all contact details and to indicate their dietary preferences.
