NOTE BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR A REGIONAL TRAINING COURSE ON CHEMICAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE FOR POLICE FIRST RESPONDERS BOGOTÁ, COLOMBIA 3 – 7 APRIL 2017

- 1. On behalf of the Government of Colombia and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW), the Director-General wishes to invite Member States from the GRULAC¹ region to nominate qualifying representatives to participate in a regional training course on chemical emergency response intended for first responders from police and/or law enforcement authorities, which will take place from 3 to 7 April 2017 in Bogotá, Colombia.
- 2. The course will be jointly organised by the Government of Colombia and the Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat"). It will provide training for up to 20 participants in aspects related to response to attacks with chemical warfare agents and incidents with toxic industrial chemicals under the provisions of Article X of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Convention").
- 3. The course will offer an introduction to basic toxicology, the types and uses of individual protective equipment, reconnaissance, detection, decontamination, and forensics, as well as other relevant topics. It will also cover elements related to risk assessment, prevention, and response to chemical emergencies. The course is also aimed at facilitating the exchange of information and fostering networking among the participants, with a view to enhancing the implementation of Article X of the Convention in the GRULAC region.
- 4. Candidates for this course should preferably belong to institutions such as the police and/or other national law enforcement bodies from GRULAC Member States that would act as first responders in a chemical emergency. Consequently, participants will be carefully selected based on their current functions. Participants should also be physically fit and able to wear individual protective gear during the practical sessions of the course.
- 5. Endorsement by the National Authority of the candidate's Member State is a prerequisite for being considered in the selection process.
- 6. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor a maximum of 20 participants. When proposing candidates for the course, Member States should specify whether such

sponsorship is a condition of their participation. For sponsored participants, the Secretariat will cover the costs of travel, accommodation, transfers to and from the airport, medical insurance, and meals (lunch), and will provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover sundry expenses.

- 7. Further details regarding accommodation, the course venue, transport, and the final programme will be issued to participants in due course.
- 8. When making travel arrangements for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. Sponsored participants are encouraged to use the tickets provided by the Secretariat. Participants are expected to arrive **no earlier than Sunday**, **2 April 2017** and to depart **no later than Saturday**, **8 April 2017**. The Secretariat's approval is required for any changes to the arrival and departure dates of sponsored participants. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the course or that result from unauthorised changes to travel arrangements. Sponsored participants must bear all costs resulting from changes they make, including cancellations, once the Secretariat has purchased their tickets.
- 9. Participants are requested to obtain all necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to Colombia.
- 10. The course will be conducted in Spanish, and participants are therefore required to have a good working knowledge of Spanish, both written and oral. No interpretation services will be provided during this course.
- 11. Interested candidates are invited to complete the nomination form that is included as Annex 2 to this Note, giving their full name, passport details, address, fax and telephone numbers, email address, current functions, and area(s) of expertise. The completed nomination form, together with a brief curriculum vitae for each nominee, should be sent to the Assistance and Protection Branch of the International Cooperation and Assistance Division, OPCW, Johan de Wittlaan 32, 2517 JR The Hague, the Netherlands. Nominations may be submitted by email to EmergAssistBr@opcw.org with a reference to the title and location of the course in the subject line of the message. Nominations should be submitted as soon as possible, but **no later than 30 November 2016**, in order to allow sufficient time for the Secretariat to make the necessary arrangements.
