#### NOTE BY THE TECHNICAL SECRETARIAT

# CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR A SYMPOSIUM ON WOMEN IN CHEMISTRY AND A BASIC ANALYTICAL CHEMISTRY COURSE FOR WOMEN CHEMISTS THE HAGUE AND RIJSWIJK, THE NETHERLANDS 2 – 5 MAY 2017

### **Purpose of the course**

- 1. The OPCW Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat") wishes to inform Member States that, in association with the celebration of the twentieth anniversary of the entry into force of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Convention"), it will hold a symposium on women in chemistry at the OPCW Headquarters in The Hague, the Netherlands on 2 May 2017, which will be followed by a basic analytical chemistry course for women chemists at the OPCW Laboratory in Rijswijk, the Netherlands from 3 to 5 May 2017.
- 2. The theme for this year's symposium is "Women as a Force for the Peaceful Uses of Chemistry". The aim of the symposium is to illustrate the strength and depth of the contributions of women in chemistry; to raise awareness of capacity development for women in chemistry; and to promote international solidarity and cooperation in this regard.
- 3. The aim of the analytical chemistry course is to assist qualified women analytical chemists from Member States whose economies are developing or in transition in acquiring further knowledge and experience, specifically as it relates to the analysis of chemicals related to the Convention, and to facilitate the adoption of good laboratory practices and quality standards.

#### **Content**

- 4. The one-day symposium will focus on thematic presentations and discussions featuring prominent role models to address various aspects of interest and concern for women working towards peaceful uses of chemistry, including the particular challenges and opportunities they face. Group discussions will also be arranged to focus on education, capacity building, and career advancement for women chemists. The symposium will also provide an opportunity to share significant research achievements by women chemists.
- 5. The three-day course will focus on basic training in gas chromatography-mass spectrometry (GC-MS), and will include study/demonstration tours related to the use of these and other techniques for the analysis of chemicals related to the Convention.

It is expected that the participants in the analytical chemistry course will also attend the symposium.

## **Admission requirements**

- 6. The symposium is open to women who:
  - (a) have a minimum of a first degree (BSc or equivalent) in chemistry, analytical chemistry, or chemical engineering from a recognised university or institution; and
  - (b) have professional working experience in academia, science and technology institutions, chemical industry or industry associations, or regulatory or promotional agencies related to chemical sciences.
- 7. The analytical chemistry course is open to women who:
  - (a) have a minimum of a first degree (BSc or equivalent) in analytical chemistry, chemistry, or related chemical sciences from a recognised university or institution, with relevant practical and theoretical experience in analytical chemistry;
  - (b) have experience working with GC-MS techniques;
  - (c) are citizens of Member States whose economies are developing or in transition; and
  - (d) have been working in a chemical laboratory or research institution in their home country for **at least three years**.
- 8. The symposium and analytical chemistry course will be conducted in English. Candidates must therefore have a strong command of both written and spoken English. Any candidate who is found upon arrival not to meet this requirement may not be allowed to continue their participation in the events.

## **Selection procedure**

- 9. Applications will be carefully screened on the basis of the criteria specified in paragraphs 6 and 7 above. Applicants who have already participated in the OPCW Analytical Skills Development Course programme will not be considered for the analytical chemistry course.
- 10. Member States are welcome to nominate participants for whom sponsorship is not required.

## **Sponsorship**

11. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor a maximum of 30 participants for the symposium. Of these 30, a maximum of nine participants may attend the analytical chemistry course. All sponsored participants must be citizens of Member States whose economies are developing or are in transition. The Secretariat will select the participants based on their qualifications and experience. Only selected candidates

- will be notified by the Secretariat. In the meantime, Member States are welcome to nominate for participation in the symposium non-sponsored female participants who meet the admission requirements indicated in paragraph 6 above.
- 12. Each application form should specify whether sponsorship is a condition of the nominee's participation. All applications from Member States must be formally endorsed by the National Authority.
- 13. For sponsored participants, the Secretariat will cover the costs of travel and medical insurance, and will provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover meals and sundry expenses. The Secretariat will also arrange and pay for the accommodation of sponsored participants. Sponsored participants who do not intend to use the accommodation arranged by the Secretariat are requested to indicate that as soon as possible, so that the Secretariat does not incur hotel cancellation fees. In any case, the Secretariat will not cover the costs of any accommodation that it has not arranged.
- 14. The Secretariat will not pay for medical assistance. Therefore, participants should be fit to travel. All participants taking prescribed medication should arrive with supplies sufficient for the duration of the events.
- 15. When making travel arrangement for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. The Secretariat will purchase tickets and send them to the participants. Participants will be allowed to purchase tickets locally only if this leads to further savings for the Secretariat and if the Secretariat authorises it. Sponsored participants shall bear all costs resulting from any changes they make once the Secretariat has purchased the tickets. Non-sponsored participants will be requested to make their own travel and accommodation arrangements, although the Secretariat can, if necessary, arrange accommodation. In order for the Secretariat to keep costs to a minimum, sponsored participants are expected to arrive no earlier than **Monday**, 1 May 2017 and to depart no later than Saturday, 6 May 2017.
- 16. Participants are requested to obtain any necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to The Hague. The Secretariat will cover the costs of these visas by reimbursing sponsored participants upon production of original receipts.

## **Application procedure**

- 17. Candidates who are interested in applying for the symposium are invited fill out the forms in Annexes 2 and 3 to this Note. Candidates who are interested in applying for both the symposium and the analytical chemistry course are invited to fill out the forms in Annexes 2, 3, and 4.
- 18. Applications that are incomplete or improperly filled out cannot be considered. Application forms must be accompanied by the following:
  - (a) a photocopy of the personal identification pages of the candidate's passport;
  - (b) an up-to-date curriculum vitae;
  - (c) a one-page description of the candidate's practical experience;

- (d) (for analytical chemistry course candidates only) a letter of recommendation from the candidate's supervisor that addresses her qualifications and attests to the relevance of the course to the work of the institution; and
- (e) an endorsement from the National Authority of the candidate's country.
- 19. Applications should be submitted to the Secretariat, via the respective Member State's National Authority or Permanent Representation to the OPCW, **no later than Friday**, **3 March 2017**. Once endorsed, the Permanent Representation should then send the application to the Director, International Cooperation and Assistance Division, OPCW, Johan de Wittlaan 32, 2517 JR The Hague, the Netherlands. Applications may also be sent by email to icb@opcw.org indicating "Women in Chemistry" in the subject line of the message. Please be advised that participants must present an OPCW acceptance letter in order to register for the events.
