NOTE BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR A REGIONAL TABLE-TOP EXERCISE IN CHEMICAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE FOR STATES PARTIES IN LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN SANTO DOMINGO, DOMINICAN REPUBLIC 15 – 19 OCTOBER 2018

- 1. On behalf of the Government of the Dominican Republic and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW), the Director-General wishes to invite Member States from the GRULAC¹ region to nominate representatives to participate in a regional table-top exercise in chemical emergency response, to take place from 15 to 19 October in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic.
- 2. The exercise will be jointly organised by the Government of the Dominican Republic and the Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat") and is aimed at enhancing chemical response preparedness at the regional and sub regional levels in accordance with the recommendations received from the Third Special Session of the Conference of the States Parties to Review the Operation of the Chemical Weapons Convention regarding the implementation of Article X of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Convention").
- 3. The event will address matters related to coordination in case of a major chemical incident. The exercise will concentrate on operational frameworks such as relevant policies, communication, and information sharing, including operational and procedural issues related to consequence management, so as to ensure effective response and provision of assistance in case of incidents involving toxic chemicals.
- 4. The exercise is also aimed at facilitating the exchange of information and fostering networking among the participants representing national institutions, with a view to enhancing the implementation of Article X of the Convention in the GRULAC region as a whole. Applicants should be familiar with response practices and procedures in the event of attacks involving chemical warfare agents and/or incidents with toxic industrial chemicals, in line with the provisions of Article X of the Convention.
- 5. Given the objectives of the exercise, candidates will be carefully selected. They should be members of emergency response units from institutions involved in civilian

- defence. A background in the field of chemistry associated with chemical warfare agents and toxic chemicals is highly desirable. Participants should be physically fit and able to wear individual protective gear during the exercise if necessary.
- 6. Only candidates endorsed by the National Authority of their Member States will be considered in the selection process. The Secretariat will select only one participant from a given Member State.
- 7. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor a maximum of 25 participants. When proposing candidates for the exercise, Member States should specify whether such sponsorship is a condition of their participation. For sponsored participants, the Secretariat will cover the costs of travel, accommodation, transfers to and from the airport, medical insurance, and meals, and will provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover sundry expenses.
- 8. Further details regarding accommodation, the exercise venue, transport, and the final programme will be issued to participants in due course.
- 9. Participants are requested to obtain all necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to the Dominican Republic. To that end, selected participants will receive an acceptance letter and other supporting documents if required.
- 10. When making travel arrangements for selected participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. Participants are expected to arrive in Mexico City no earlier than Sunday, 14 October 2018 and depart no later than Saturday, 20 October 2018. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the exercise or that result from unauthorised changes to travel arrangements. Sponsored participants must bear all costs resulting from changes they make, including cancellations, once the Secretariat has purchased their tickets.
- 11. All GRULAC Member States are encouraged to nominate candidates for this event, which will be conducted in Spanish. Participants are required to have a good command of Spanish, both written and oral. No interpretation services will be provided during the event.
- 12. Interested applicants are invited to register their nomination online through Eventus—the OPCW event management system—no later than 15 August 2018. The Eventus registration link is accessible via the **OPCW** website at: http://apps.opcw.org/eventus. Please note that all questions marked with an asterisk (*) must be answered in order for the nomination to be received and for the candidate to be considered for this event. The endorsement form attached as Annex 3 to this note has to be uploaded during the registration process for the course.
- 13. Interested applicants who, for technical reasons, are unable to submit their application online via Eventus are requested to complete and send the nomination and endorsement forms attached as Annexes 2 and 3 to this note to EmergAssistBr@opcw.org with reference to the name and location of the event in the subject line.

- 14. Candidates who have been selected to participate in the course will be contacted no later than two weeks after the submission deadline. States Parties are requested to inform the International Cooperation and Assistance Division of any administrative or other problems that may arise in connection with the attendance of any participant.
- 15. The provisional programme of the course is included as Annex 1 to this Note. Further details regarding accommodation, the course venue, transport, and an updated version of the programme will be submitted to all selected participants at a later date.
