On 7 June 2016 at a meeting with the Chargé d'Affaires of South Sudan in New York, the Deputy Director-General, was informed that the government of South Sudan was reconsidering options for succession and accession in the wake of advice received from the Treaties Section of the United Nations Office of Legal Affairs. In 2017 the Secretariat continued to assist and consult South Sudan concerning accession to the Convention membership. In this regard, the Secretariat has provided the necessary legal guidance and information and has offered further technical support and consultations. It is currently understood that the next step (depositing the instrument of succession) will have to be made by the South Sudanese authorities. The State of Palestine deposited on 17 May 2018 its instrument of accession to the Chemical Weapons Convention with the Secretary-General of the United Nations, the depository of the Convention.
