Instructions


- Participants form groups of 5 6 individuals

- Group feedback to all participants




- Group 1 Education

Ask challenging questions, confront the problems, ask for solutions














Step 3

Go back to your original group and share with them what happened in your combined experts group




Outcomes

- Where there any compromises?


Conclusion: All principles are equally important
