NOTE BY THE TECHNICAL SECRETARIAT

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR THE EIGHTH ASSISTANCE AND PROTECTION COURSE FOR INSTRUCTORS FROM AFRICAN STATES PARTIES TSHWANE, SOUTH AFRICA 12 – 23 AUGUST 2019

- 1. On behalf of the Government of South Africa and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW), the Director-General wishes to invite States Parties in Africa to nominate representatives to participate in the Eighth Assistance and Protection Course for Instructors from African States Parties, which will take place from 12 to 23 August 2019 in Tshwane, South Africa.
- 2. The course will be jointly organised by the Government of South Africa and the Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat"), and will provide training for instructors who are involved in training first responders to chemical emergency incidents. The course will cover the following topics:
 - (a) planning and building a support team for civilian protection and defence;
 - (b) rescue and decontamination operations in contaminated areas; and
 - (c) appropriate responses and countermeasures in the event of incidents involving chemical-warfare agents or toxic chemicals.
- 3. The course will help participating States Parties enhance the abilities and skills of their national instructors when training first responders in how to provide protection against chemical weapons and other toxic chemicals, as well as in how to manage chemical incidents.
- 4. The course will also provide an overview of the kinds of assistance the OPCW, the host country, and other States Parties in Africa can provide in the area of assistance and protection.
- 5. The course will include individual and team procedures, tactics, and processes to deliver required operational readiness and to understand the complexity of hot/warm/cold zone management during chemical incidents.
- 6. The course will offer an introduction to the use of individual and collective protective equipment, to monitoring, detection, and decontamination, and to sampling techniques. It will also facilitate the exchange of information and experiences

regarding the implementation of Article X of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Convention"), and provide a forum for States Parties to discuss how they can cooperate in the future and what further offers they might make to the OPCW under Article X. The course, which will include a visit to Protechnik Laboratories, will conclude with a table-top and field emergency response exercise.

- 7. Given the purpose of the course and its technical nature, candidates will be carefully selected according to the following criteria:
 - (a) All participants should be first responder instructors/trainers, or be involved in developing an emergency-response system in their own countries.
 - (b) All participants must have a good oral and written command of English, as all activities during the course will be conducted in English and no interpretation services of any kind will be available.
 - (c) Preference will be given to instructors from emergency response units, such as firefighters, ambulance personnel, and police officers.
 - (d) Participants must be physically fit and capable of wearing individual protective gear for several hours at a time in hot weather. Some practical experience with protective equipment is desirable.
- 8. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor a limited number of participants from States Parties. For sponsored participants, it will cover the costs of accommodation and meals. The National Authority of South Africa will also provide all participants with course materials and local transport, at no cost to either the participants or the OPCW. Further details regarding accommodation, the course venue, and transport will be issued to all confirmed participants at a later date.
- 9. When making travel arrangements for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. Sponsored participants will be allowed to purchase tickets locally only if this leads to further savings for the Secretariat and if the Secretariat authorises it. In order for the Secretariat to keep costs to a minimum, sponsored participants are expected arrive to no earlier than Sunday, 11 August 2019, and to depart no later than Saturday, 24 August 2019. The Secretariat's approval is required for any changes to the arrival and departure dates of sponsored participants. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the course or that result from changes in travel arrangements that it has not authorised. Sponsored participants must bear all costs resulting from changes they make, including cancellations, once the Secretariat has purchased their tickets. Participants who have not been sponsored are requested to make their own travel arrangements.
- 10. Participants are requested to obtain all necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to South Africa.
- 11. Participants are requested to prepare a short presentation on their chemical emergency response system, to be presented during the second week of the training.

- 12. Interested applicants are invited to register their nomination through Eventus—the OPCW event management system—no later than 20 June 2019. The Eventus registration link is accessible via the OPCW website (https://apps.opcw.org/eventus). Please note that all questions marked with an asterisk (*) in the online registration form must be answered, and an endorsement letter from the relevant National Authority (see Annex 3) must be attached in order for the nomination to be received and for the candidate to be considered for this event. Interested applicants who, for technical reasons, are unable to submit their application online via Eventus are requested to send the nomination form (Annex 2) along with the endorsement from the National Authority via email attachment (EmergAssistBr@opcw.org) with a reference to the name and location of the event in the subject line of the message. Selected participants will be contacted no later than two weeks after the submission deadline.
