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NOTE BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR THE SIXTH ANNUAL MEETING OF REPRESENTATIVES OF CHEMICAL INDUSTRY AND NATIONAL AUTHORITIES OF STATES PARTIES TO THE CHEMICAL WEAPONS CONVENTION DOHA, QATAR 15 – 17 OCTOBER 2019

- 1. On behalf of the Government of Qatar and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW), the Director-General is pleased to invite National Authorities and representatives from national chemical industry associations to submit applications to participate in the Sixth Annual Meeting of Representatives of the Chemical Industry and National Authorities of States Parties to the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereafter "the Convention"), to be held at the Doha Regional Centre for CBRN Training in Doha, Qatar, from 15 to 17 October 2019. This meeting has been made possible thanks to a voluntary contribution from the Government of Qatar.
- 2. The event is being organised to enhance engagement with the chemical industry and increase collaboration with National Authorities to support the full and effective implementation of the Convention.
- 3. The chemical industry has been recognised as a key stakeholder in the implementation of the Convention. The Third Special Session of the Conference of the States Parties to Review the Operation of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Third Review Conference") highlighted the important role that the chemical industry has to play in the implementation of the Convention, and encouraged the Secretariat to continue to strengthen its relations with regional and international chemical industry associations. Engaging the chemical industry in particular was encouraged with regard to the OPCW's verification activities and activities not prohibited under the Convention, among other aspects.
- 4. The Third Review Conference also highlighted the need to provide continued support to National Authorities of States Parties in their efforts to ensure the full and effective implementation of the Convention. Assisting National Authorities to reach out to and collaborate with the chemical industry as a key stakeholder in implementation at the national level has therefore become a priority thematic area for the capacity-building

programmes of the Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat"). Moreover, the important role that the chemical industry could play in the capacity building of States Parties has been highlighted in recent years.

- 5. The specific objectives of the meeting are to:
 - (a) foster collaboration and cooperation between National Authorities and the chemical industry, facilitate the exchange of experience and good practices at the sub-regional, regional, and global levels;
 - (b) raise awareness of the specific requirements under relevant provisions of the Convention among representatives of the chemical industry and the National Authorities;
 - (c) review current practices and challenges in selected issues concerning the implementation of the Convention for which collaboration between the chemical industry and National Authorities is crucial; and
 - (d) further enhance the general capacity of both stakeholders to implement the relevant provisions of the Convention in order to improve the quality and timeliness of the fulfilment of obligations.
- 6. The provisional programme for the meeting is attached as Annex 1 to this Note. The meeting will focus discussions on current issues and developments relating to the following topics:
 - (a) efforts to continually improve the efficiency and effectiveness of Article VI verification, including the role of national chemical industry associations and National Authorities;
 - (b) developing tools and a mechanism for enhanced cooperation between National Authorities and chemical industry in raising awareness of the Convention nationally; and
 - (c) the role of Article VI verification in the light of emerging threats and chemical terrorism; tools for chemical risk assessment and management.
- 7. The discussions in the meeting will be built upon the outcomes of the same meeting in the last five years, particularly through reviewing the Outcome Report of the 2018 meeting. A copy of the Outcome Report shall be available from the National Authorities or from the contact persons of the Implementation Support Branch as mentioned below.
- 8. States Parties for whom participation in this meeting would be beneficial to their ongoing efforts to enhance implementation of the Convention, through strengthened collaboration amongst national stakeholders—particularly with the chemical industry—are invited to nominate participants. States Parties that are willing to share best practices in the same area will be given priority for participation in the meeting. States Parties are invited to nominate **two participants**, one from their National Authority and another from a national chemical industry association. States Parties are strongly encouraged to nominate candidates who have not participated in this meeting

- in the past. Priority for sponsorship will be given to participants who have not participated in this meeting in the past.
- 9. The meeting will be conducted in English. All participants are therefore expected to have a good oral and written command of English.
- 10. Interested National Authorities and representatives of the national chemical industry in States Parties are invited to submit their applications through EVENTUS, the OPCW event management system (https://apps.opcw.org/eventus/Home/EventDetail/113). Use of Google Chrome is advisable. Applicants must first create an account and then register for the event.
- 11. Only nominations endorsed by the National Authority will be considered. The endorsement form (attached as Annex 2 to this Note) must be uploaded during the online registration process.
- 12. In addition, interested participants are required to complete the Motivation Statement (attached as Annex 3 to this Note). Use of a Microsoft Word version of the Motivation Statement form is strongly recommended this can be obtained from Mr Alberto Fernández (alberto.fernandez@opcw.org). Applicants are advised to type in their own Motivation Statement individually and to send it, along with the applicant's curriculum vitae, via email attachment to Mr Alberto Fernández (alberto.fernandez@opcw.org), clearly stating "Doha meeting" in the subject line of the message. The Motivation Statement and the curriculum vitae must be submitted before 26 July 2019 so that the organiser can determine whether the applicants are suitable for participation in this meeting.
- 13. Only nominations with the complete set of application documents will be considered. Nominations with only one participant from a State Party (either from the National Authority or a chemical industry representative) will not be considered. Moreover, the Secretariat will not be able to accept any nominations for sponsorship after 26 July 2019.
- 14. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor a limited number of participants. Each nomination should specify whether sponsorship is a condition of the nominee's participation. For sponsored participants, the Secretariat will cover the costs of travel and medical insurance, and will provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover meals and sundry expenses. The Secretariat will also arrange and pay for the accommodation of sponsored participants. Sponsored participants who do not intend to use the accommodation arranged by the Secretariat are requested to inform the Secretariat at the time of confirmation of their participation in the meeting in order to avoid incurring hotel cancellation fees. In any case, the Secretariat will not cover the costs of any accommodation that it has not arranged.
- 15. Participants should also be fit to travel. All participants taking prescribed medication should arrive with supplies sufficient for the duration of the event.
- 16. When making travel arrangements for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. It will purchase tickets and send them to the participants. Participants will be allowed to purchase tickets locally only if this leads to further savings for the Secretariat and if the Secretariat authorises it. Sponsored

participants must bear all costs resulting from any changes they make once the Secretariat has purchased the tickets. Participants who have not been sponsored will be asked to make their own travel and accommodation arrangements, although the Secretariat can, if necessary, arrange accommodation. In order to keep costs to a minimum, sponsored participants are expected to arrive no earlier than **Monday**, **14 October 2019** and to depart no later than **Friday**, **18 October 2019**. The Secretariat's agreement is required for any changes to these arrival and departure dates. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the course or that result from changes in travel arrangements that it has not authorised. Sponsored participants must bear all costs resulting from changes they make, including cancellations, once the Secretariat has purchased tickets.

- 17. It is the responsibility of each participant to ensure that all necessary visas (including transit visas) are obtained before travelling to Doha. When applying for any required visa, they should present a copy of their acceptance letter issued by the Secretariat.
