NOTE BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR AN OPCW ASSISTANCE AND PROTECTION TRAINING COURSE FOR INSTRUCTORS FROM LATIN AMERICAN AND CARIBBEAN STATES PARTIES MEXICO CITY, MEXICO, 11 – 15 NOVEMBER 2019

- 1. On behalf of the Government of Mexico and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW), the Director-General wishes to invite States Parties from the Latin American and Caribbean Group (GRULAC) to nominate representatives to participate in an assistance and protection course for instructors from the GRULAC region, which will take place from 11 to 15 November 2019 in Mexico City, Mexico.
- 2. This course will help participating States Parties enhance the knowledge and skills of their national instructors involved in training first responders to cases of chemical attacks or incidents involving toxic industrial chemicals, and will be jointly organised by the Government of Mexico and the Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat").
- 3. The course will provide training for up to 20 instructors from institutions in the GRULAC region involved in the provision of regional assistance and protection and emergency response training under Article X of the Chemical Weapons Convention.
- 4. The course is expected to contribute to the enhancement of regional response capabilities as a whole, and is aimed at consolidating the Secretariat's regional approach to assistance and protection capacity building within the GRULAC region by enhancing the training skills of regional instructors. Participants will also have the opportunity to engage in extensive information exchange and networking, specifically targeting the practices and procedures related to the conduct of assistance and protection training.

- 5. The course will cover the following topics, among others:
 - (a) chemical warfare agents and toxic industrial chemicals (theoretical segment);
 - (b) protection of personnel and equipment in a chemical emergency;
 - (c) rescue and decontamination operations in contaminated areas;
 - (d) appropriate responses and countermeasures during incidents involving chemical warfare agents or toxic industrial chemicals; and
 - (e) the didactics of emergency response training.
- 6. Given the purpose of the course and its technical nature, candidates will be carefully selected according to the following criteria:
 - (a) Applicants should be first responders, instructors or trainers, or be involved in the implementation of emergency response policies in their own countries. They should preferably belong to the staff of training institutions in the GRULAC region. Ideally, applicants should also have passed courses provided by the OPCW at the exercise level.
 - (b) Participants must be physically fit and capable of wearing individual protective equipment for several hours at a time.
 - (c) As the course will be conducted in Spanish, participants must have a good command of the Spanish language. No interpretation services of any kind will be provided.
- 7. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor a limited number of participants. For sponsored participants, it will cover the costs of accommodation, travel, medical insurance, and meals, and will provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover sundry expenses. Participants will arrive in Mexico City on Sunday, 10 November 2019 and depart on Saturday, 16 November 2019. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the course or that result from unauthorised changes to travel arrangements. Participants are requested to obtain all necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to Mexico.
- 8. Interested applicants are invited to register their nomination online through the **Eventus** platform—the OPCW event management system—no later than **9 August 2019.** The Eventus registration link is accessible via the OPCW website at: **https://apps.opcw.org/eventus**. Please note that all questions marked with an asterisk (*) must be answered in order for the nomination to be received and for the candidate to be considered for this event. The endorsement form attached as Annex 3 to this note must be uploaded during the registration process for the course.
- 9. Interested applicants who, for technical reasons, are unable to submit their application online via Eventus are requested to complete and send the nomination and endorsement forms attached as Annexes 2 and 3 to this note to EmergAssistBr@opcw.org and jquinteromendez@opcw.org with reference to the name and location of the event in the subject line.

- 10. Candidates who have been selected to participate in the course will be contacted no later than two weeks after the submission deadline. States Parties are requested to inform the International Cooperation and Assistance Division of any administrative or other problems that may arise in connection with the attendance of any participant.
- 11. The provisional programme of the course is included as Annex 1 to this Note. Further details regarding accommodation, the course venue, transport, and an updated version of the programme will be provided to all selected participants at a later date.
