They were the first and main force to fight against ISIS. Today we are sad as we feel betrayed and abandoned once again.

I have been working as a volunteer for more than fifteen years with Mayors for Peace and the International Peace Bureau in order to have a better and more peaceful world for our children.

I want to invite all OPCW members and participants in this conference to work much harder in support of the plight of the Kurdish people. Kurds want and need to be recognized with a full membership and representation at the UN.

Together we will be stronger to work towards peace in the Middle East, Africa, Asia, and any other place on earth where people suffer from violence and exclusion. Let us work together for all people who should live free and with respect to their basic human rights, in a world free of war and environmental destruction. We want a world where our children can grow up without racism and war. Let us work together.
