Subitem 6(a): Reports by the Director-General on destruction-related issues

- 6.1 Further to a decision by the Conference of the States Parties (hereinafter "the Conference") at its Sixteenth Session (C-16/DEC.11, dated 1 December 2011), the Council is **requested** to consider and note a report by the Director-General on the overall progress with respect to the destruction of the remaining chemical weapons stockpiles (EC-94/DG.18, dated 1 July 2020).
- 6.2 Further to a decision by the Council at its Sixty-Seventh Session (EC-67/DEC.6, dated 15 February 2012), the Council is **requested** to consider and note a report by the Director-General on the overall progress in the destruction of abandoned chemical weapons (EC-94/DG.19, dated 1 July 2020).

Subitem 6(b): Implementation of the Conference of the States Parties and Executive Council decisions on destruction-related issues

- 6.3 The Secretariat provided an update to the Council on its destruction-related verification activities (presentations were posted on the external server of the OPCW).
- 6.4 The States Parties concerned provided an update to the Council on their destruction-related activities (presentations/a statement were posted on the external server of the OPCW).
- 6.5 Further to a decision by the Conference at its Sixteenth Session (C-16/DEC.11), the Council is **requested** to consider and note a national paper by the United States of America on the progress achieved towards complete destruction of its chemical weapons stockpile, including information on measures to accelerate such progress, and identifying progress made since the last briefing in order to meet the planned completion date. This report is also to include reporting on any specific measures undertaken to overcome problems in the destruction programme (EC-94/NAT.11, dated 17 June 2020).
- 6.6 Further to a decision by the Council at its Sixty-Seventh Session (EC-67/DEC.6) and the destruction plan beyond the year 2016 for the chemical weapons abandoned by Japan in China (EC-84/NAT.6, dated 2 March 2017), attached as Annex 2 to Council decision EC-67/DEC.6 and adopted by the Council at its Eighty-Fourth Session (paragraph 6.14 of EC-84/2, dated 9 March 2017), a national paper by China (EC-94/NAT.12, dated 18 June 2020) and a national paper by Japan (EC-94/NAT.13, dated 18 June 2020) on the overall progress of the destruction of chemical weapons abandoned by Japan on the territory of China have been circulated to the members of the Council.

Subitem 6(c): Elimination of the Syrian chemical weapons programme

- 6.7 Further to its decision at its Eighty-Third Session (EC-83/DEC.5, dated 11 November 2016), the Council decided to place "Elimination of the Syrian Chemical Weapons Programme" on the agenda of all future Council sessions until the Council determines that all elements of the Syrian chemical weapons programme have been eliminated.
- 6.8 The Council is **requested** to note Notes by the Director-General reporting on progress in the elimination of the Syrian chemical weapons programme (EC-94/DG.1, dated 24 March 2020; EC-94/DG.3, dated 24 April 2020; EC-94/DG.5, dated 25 May 2020; and EC-94/DG.12, dated 24 June 2020).
- 6.9 The Council is **requested** to note the national papers by the Syrian Arab Republic on the activities related to the destruction of Syrian chemical weapons and their production facilities (EC-94/P/NAT.1, dated 18 March 2020; EC-94/P/NAT.2, dated 16 April 2020; EC-94/P/NAT.3, dated 20 May 2020; and EC-94/P/NAT.4, dated 16 June 2020).
- 6.10 Pursuant to subparagraph 12(a) of its decision EC-83/DEC.5, the Council decided that the Director-General shall regularly inform the Council on the implementation of this decision. The Council is **requested** to note a report by the Director-General on the matter (EC-94/DG.20, dated 3 July 2020).
- 6.11 The Council is **requested** to note a Note by the Director-General entitled "Report on the Work of the Declaration Assessment Team" (EC-94/HP/DG.2, dated 29 June 2020).

Subitem 6(d): Other verification-related issues

- 6.12 The Secretariat provided to the Council an update on its other verification-related activities (a presentation was posted on the external server of the OPCW).
- 6.13 Further to the decision of the Council at its Sixty-Sixth Session on the policy guidelines for determining the number of Article VI inspections (EC-66/DEC.10, dated 7 October 2011), the Council is **requested** to note a report by the Director-General on the results of the eighth year of implementation of these policy guidelines (EC-94/DG.2, dated 7 April 2020).

- 6.15 The Secretariat has submitted to the Council a Note on modifications to the agreed detailed plan for verification of the destruction of chemical weapons at the Pueblo Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant Chemical Weapons Destruction Facility, Pueblo, Colorado, the United States of America (EC-94/S/2, dated 6 April 2020).
- 6.16 The Secretariat has submitted to the Council a Note on modifications to the agreed detailed plan for verification of the destruction of chemical weapons at the Blue Grass Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant, Chemical Weapons Destruction Facility, Richmond, Kentucky, the United States of America (EC-94/S/3, dated 6 April 2020).
- 6.17 The Secretariat has submitted to the Council a Note on modifications to the agreed detailed plan for verification of the destruction of chemical weapons at the Blue Grass Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant Static Detonation Chamber Chemical Weapons Destruction Facility, Richmond, Kentucky, the United States of America (EC-94/S/4, dated 6 April 2020).

- 6.19 The Secretariat circulated a Note entitled "First Report of the Technical Secretariat Pursuant to Paragraph 10 of Decision C-SS-4/DEC.3 (dated 27 June 2018)" (EC-94/S/5, dated 8 April 2020). The report (S/1867/2020, dated 8 April 2020) is provided to the Council and the United Nations Secretary-General for their consideration.
- 6.20 The Secretariat circulated a national paper by France (EC-94/NAT.18, dated 2 July 2020) as well as a draft decision, supported by 40 delegations, entitled "Addressing the Possession and Use of Chemical Weapons by the Syrian Arab Republic" (EC-94/DEC/CRP.2/Rev.1, dated 7 July 2020), which the Council is **requested** to consider and adopt.
- 6.21 In accordance with Rule 34 of the Rules of Procedure of the Council, the Secretariat circulated a Report by the Director-General (EC-94/DG.21, dated 2 July 2020) on the financial, administrative, and programme and budget implications of the above-mentioned draft decision.

- 10.2 In accordance with Rule 31 of the Rules of Procedure of the Council, the delegation of the Russian Federation submitted amendments to the above-mentioned draft decision (EC-92/DEC/CRP.6, dated 4 October 2019).
- 10.3 Subsequently, the sponsoring delegations submitted a revision to the above-mentioned draft decision (EC-92/DEC/CRP.1/Rev.2, dated 10 October 2019).

- 10.4 The Council at its previous session decided to defer the matter until its next regular session.
- 10.5 The delegation of the Russian Federation withdrew its proposal through a note verbale dated 25 February 2020 and submitted new amendments on the matter (EC-93/DEC/CRP.2, dated 21 February 2020), together with an explanatory note to it (EC-93/NAT.3, dated 20 February 2020).
- 10.6 The Council is **requested** to take appropriate action on the matter.

Subitem 10(b): Report of the Advisory Body on Administrative and Financial Matters

- 10.7 Further to its consideration of this issue at its previous sessions, the Council is **requested** to consider and note the report of the Forty-Fifth Session of the Advisory Body on Administrative and Financial Matters (ABAF), which took place from 31 July to 3 August 2018 (ABAF-45/1, dated 3 August 2018), and a Note by the Director-General containing comments on the report of the ABAF at that session (EC-89/DG.11, dated 28 August 2018).

The Council is **requested** to consider the Note by the Director-General containing a summary of nominations for this post (EC-94/DG.9, dated 15 June 2020). In the light of these nominations, the Council is **requested** to make a recommendation on the appointment of the External Auditor of the OPCW, and to forward it to the Conference at its Twenty-Fifth Session.
