REPORT BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

OPCW INCOME AND EXPENDITURE FOR THE PERIOD 1 JANUARY TO 30 SEPTEMBER 2020 (THIRD QUARTER OF THE FINANCIAL YEAR ENDING 31 DECEMBER 2020)

Background

- 1. In paragraph 14.1 of the report of its Forty-First Session (EC-41/5, dated 1 July 2005), the Executive Council (hereinafter "the Council") noted the report of the Eighteenth Session of the Advisory Body on Administrative and Financial Matters (ABAF-18/1, dated 13 May 2005), including its view that the Director-General should report quarterly to the Council on income and expenditure.
- 2. The Director-General hereby submits to the Council a commentary on the quarterly financial position and, as annexes to this report, the detailed statements indicating the income and expenditure performance of the OPCW for the period 1 January to 30 September 2020, together with information on prior years, where this is useful for comparative or explanatory purposes.

Commentary

Status of outstanding assessed contributions for 2020 (Annex 1)

3. As at 30 September 2020, the collection rate for assessed contributions for 2020 was 76.9% (EUR 51.6 million), slightly higher than the position as at the same date in 2019 (76.8%, EUR 51.5 million), as indicated in Figure 1 below.

4. As at 30 September 2020, the total outstanding amount of assessed contributions for 2020 was EUR 15.5 million. Of this amount, a total of EUR 13.3 million related to five States Parties whose outstanding assessed contributions for 2020 were greater than EUR 0.5 million.

Ageing of all outstanding assessed contributions (Annex 1)

5. Total outstanding assessed contributions across all years amounted to EUR 20.8 million as at 30 September 2020. Most of the outstanding assessed contributions relate to 2020, as set out in Figure 2 below.



Voting rights (Annexes 2 and 3)

6. As at 30 September 2020, 21 States Parties were in arrears for assessed contributions prior to 2018, and a further two remained in arrears for multi-year payment plans. These arrears resulted in the loss of voting rights for these 23 States Parties.

Article IV and V reimbursements (Annexes 4 and 5)

7. As at 30 September 2020, an amount of EUR 0.1 million had been invoiced to States Parties for 2020 under Articles IV and V of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Convention"). Arrears in reimbursements for such inspections, totalling EUR 8.0 million as at 31 December 2019, have subsequently been reduced through payments received in the current year of EUR 0.6 million, leaving a total amount outstanding of EUR 7.5 million as at 30 September 2020.

Projected cash surplus/deficit position for 2019

8. At current state, in addition to implications in budget implementation, the Organisation may face a cash deficit position for 2019 unless significant prior year assessed contributions and Article IV and V reimbursements are received within the last quarter of 2020 and by 31 December 2020. Should a cash deficit position arise, it will have to be offset in the future by a means decided by the Conference. It is therefore important that there is movement in both of these areas to avoid such a situation.

Budget implementation (Annex 6)

9. The total budget implementation rate (including disbursements and obligations) as at 30 September 2020 was 72%. In Chapter 1, the implementation rate was 71%, and in Chapter 2 the rate was 73%, as outlined in Figure 3 below.

10. The Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat") monitors budget implementation on a regular basis, in line with programmatic activity and the available cash balance and forecast.

Cash position (Annex 7)

- 11. Total cash balances (across all funds) were EUR 47.8 million as at 30 September 2020, a slight increase from the balance as at 31 December 2019 (EUR 46.9 million).
- 12. Figure 4 below shows the composition of cash balances as at 30 September 2020 and 31 December 2019.

Status of the Working Capital Fund, special funds, and the Voluntary Fund for Assistance (Annex 8)

- 13. In the three quarters to 30 September 2020, the Working Capital Fund continued to maintain a fund balance of EUR 8.1 million. The special fund for the implementation of a new enterprise resource planning (ERP) system incurred net costs of EUR 1.1 million in the same period, reducing available funds from EUR 1.2 million as at 31 December 2019 to EUR 0.1 million as at 30 September 2020.
- 14. The special fund for cybersecurity, business continuity, and physical infrastructure security incurred EUR 0.3 million in costs in the reporting period, as continued investments were made in these areas.

Trust fund balances (Annex 9)

15. Available trust fund balances (excluding special funds and the Voluntary Fund for Assistance) totalled EUR 27.4 million as at 30 September 2020, of which 87% was held in the five largest trust funds, as indicated in Figure 5 below.

Impact of the COVID-19 pandemic

16. The Secretariat continues to make every effort to minimise, to the extent possible, the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic situation on the implementation of the OPCW's activities and programme for 2020 and in this regard continues to closely monitor the situation, in order to adopt appropriate mitigating measures.¹
