Subject: ICCA Support for the CWC on the Occasion of its 25<sup>th</sup> Session

Dear Mr. Chairperson, Ambassador José Zabalgoitia Trejo, dear Director General Ambassador Arias, Distinguished Delegates and Colleagues, Ladies and Gentlemen,

As the Council Secretary of the International Council of Chemical Associations (ICCA), I am pleased to reiterate our industry's strong support for the Chemical Weapons Convention (CWC) on the occasion of the 25th session of the Conference of States Parties (CSP). Undertaking this session during the global COVID-19 pandemic is a significant achievement, which we support and applaud.

ICCA's support for the purpose and objectives of the CWC remains unwavering, especially as the global chemicals industry has contributed to pandemic response around the world. The relevance of the CWC and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW) is more critical than ever, even if the destruction of existing stockpiles of chemical weapons is nearing its completion. The chemical industry and the States Parties to the CWC share a mutual interest in seeing that the international norms established by the CWC are applied fully by all governments.
