Further to the end of mission of Ambassador Nazar Issa Abdulhadi Al-Khirullah of Iraq prior to the expiry of his term of office as Vice-Chairperson of the Council from the Asian Group, the Council, in accordance with Rules 6 and 8 of its Rules of Procedure, is **requested** to elect a new Vice-Chairperson for the unexpired term of office until 11 May 2024.

7. AGENDA ITEM SEVEN – Status of implementation of the Chemical Weapons Convention

Subitem 7(a): Reports by the Director-General on destruction-related issues

- 7.1 Further to a decision by the Conference of the States Parties (hereinafter “the Conference”) at its Sixteenth Session (C-16/DEC.11, dated 1 December 2011), the Council is **requested** to consider and note a report by the Director-General on the overall progress with respect to the destruction of the remaining chemical weapons stockpiles (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations).

- 7.2 Further to a decision by the Council at its Sixty-Seventh Session (EC-67/DEC.6, dated 15 February 2012), the Council is **requested** to consider and note a report by the Director-General on the overall progress in the destruction of abandoned chemical weapons (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations).

Subitem 7(b): Implementation of the Conference of the States Parties and Executive Council decisions on destruction-related issues

- 7.3 The Secretariat is expected to provide an update to the Council on its destruction-related verification activities and on Article III-related submissions.
- 7.4 The States Parties concerned are expected to brief the Council on their destruction-related activities.
- 7.5 Further to a decision by the Conference at its Sixteenth Session (C-16/DEC.11), the Council is **requested** to consider and note a national paper by the United States of America on the progress achieved towards complete destruction of its chemical weapons stockpile, including information on measures to accelerate such progress, and identifying progress made since the last briefing in order to meet the planned completion date. This report is also to include reporting on any specific measures undertaken to overcome problems in the destruction programme (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations).
- 7.6 The Council is **requested** to consider and note the initial report of the visit by the Chairperson of the Council, the Director-General, and representatives of the Council to the Blue Grass Chemical Agent-Destruction Pilot Plant, Kentucky, the United States of America, from 12 to 14 June 2023 (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations).
- 7.7 Further to a decision by the Council at its Sixty-Seventh Session (EC-67/DEC.6) and the destruction plan beyond the year 2022 for the chemical weapons abandoned by Japan in China (EC-101/DEC.2, dated 4 October 2022), attached as Annex 3 to Council decision EC-67/DEC.6, a national paper by China (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations) and a national paper by Japan (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations) on the overall progress of the destruction of chemical weapons abandoned by Japan on the territory of China have been circulated to the members of the Council.

Subitem 7(c): Elimination of the Syrian chemical weapons programme

- 7.8 Further to its decision at its Eighty-Third Session (EC-83/DEC.5, dated 11 November 2016), the Council decided to place “Elimination of the Syrian Chemical Weapons Programme” on the agenda of all future Council sessions until the Council determines that all elements of the Syrian chemical weapons programme have been eliminated.
- 7.9 The Council is **requested** to note reports by the Director-General reporting on progress in the elimination of the Syrian chemical weapons programme (EC-103/DG.2, dated 24 March 2023; EC-103/DG.3, dated 25 April 2023; and EC-103/DG.6, dated 24 May 2023).

- 7.10 The Council is **requested** to note the national papers by the Syrian Arab Republic on the activities related to the destruction of Syrian chemical weapons and their production facilities (EC-103/P/NAT.1, dated 20 March 2023; EC-103/P/NAT.2, dated 15 April 2023; and EC-103/P/NAT.3, dated 15 May 2023).
- 7.11 The Council is **requested** to note a Note by the Director-General entitled “Report on the Work of the Declaration Assessment Team” (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations).
- 7.12 The Secretariat is expected to provide a briefing to States Parties in advance of the 103rd Session of the Council on its activities related to the Syrian Arab Republic, including on the activities of the Declaration Assessment Team, the OPCW Fact-Finding Mission in Syria, and the Investigation and Identification Team.

Subitem 7(d): Other verification-related issues

- 7.13 The Secretariat is expected to provide an update to the Council on its other verification-related activities.
- 7.14 Further to the decision of the Council at its Sixty-Sixth Session on the policy guidelines for determining the number of Article VI inspections (EC-66/DEC.10, dated 7 October 2011), the Council is **requested** to note a Note by the Director-General on the results of the eleventh year of implementation of these policy guidelines (EC-103/DG.1, dated 24 March 2023).

Subitem 7(e): Addressing the threat from chemical weapons use

- 7.15 The Council is **requested** to note the regular report by the Director-General to the Council on progress made in the implementation of the decision of the Conference entitled “Addressing the Threat from Chemical Weapons Use” (C-SS-4/DEC.3, dated 27 June 2018) (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations).

Subitem 7(f): Timely submission of declarations under Article VI of the Chemical Weapons Convention

- 7.16 Further to a decision by the Council at its Fifty-First Session (EC-51/DEC.1, dated 27 November 2007), the Council is **requested** to note a status report by the Director-General on the timely submission by States Parties of declarations under Article VI of the Chemical Weapons Convention for the period 1 January to 31 May 2023 (EC-103/DG.10, dated 16 June 2023).

Subitem 7(g): Article VII: briefings by the facilitator and by the Technical Secretariat

- 7.17 The Secretariat will make a presentation on the status of implementation of Article VII.

Subitem 7(h): The content of the Protection and Assistance Databank and its use

- 7.18 The Council is **requested** to consider and note a Note by the Secretariat on the content of the Protection and Assistance Databank and its use (EC-103/S/2, dated 16 June 2023).

Subitem 7(i): Article X: briefings by the facilitator and by the Technical Secretariat

7.19 The Secretariat will make a presentation on the status of implementation of Article X.

Subitem 7(j): Article XI: briefings by the facilitator and by the Technical Secretariat

7.20 The Secretariat will make a presentation on the programme of activities for 2023 in relation to Article XI.

Subitem 7(k): Report by the Director-General on the Technical Secretariat's readiness to conduct a challenge inspection or an investigation of alleged use

7.21 The Council is **requested** to consider and note a Note by the Director-General reporting on the readiness of the Secretariat to conduct a challenge inspection or an investigation of alleged use (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations).
