NOTE BY THE TECHNICAL SECRETARIAT

NOMINATION BY THE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS AND WORSHIP OF COSTA RICA OF A CANDIDATE FOR THE APPOINTMENT TO THE POSITION OF DIRECTOR-GENERAL

- 1. At its 108th Session, the Executive Council (the Council) adopted a decision on the "Road Map for the Process of the Appointment of the Next Director-General in 2025" (EC-108/DEC.5, dated 6 March 2025), requesting the Chairperson of the Council to invite, on the Council's behalf, States Parties to present their nominations of candidates for the position of Director-General of the Technical Secretariat of the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW) by no later than 16 May 2025, to enable their consideration by the Council.
- 2.
