6. AGENDA ITEM SIX – Status of implementation of the Chemical Weapons Convention

Subitem 6(a): Reports by the Director-General on destruction-related issues

- 6.1 Further to a decision by the Council at its Sixty-Seventh Session (EC-67/DEC.6, dated 15 February 2012), the Council is **requested** to consider and note a report by the Director-General on the overall progress in the destruction of abandoned chemical weapons (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations).

Subitem 6(b): Implementation of the Conference of the States Parties and Executive Council decisions on destruction-related issues

- 6.2 The Secretariat is expected to provide an update to the Council on its destruction-related verification activities and on Article III-related submissions.
- 6.3 The States Parties concerned are expected to brief the Council on their destruction related-activities.
- 6.4 Further to a decision by the Council at its Sixty-Seventh Session (EC-67/DEC.6) and the destruction plan beyond the year 2022 for the chemical weapons abandoned by Japan in China (EC-101/DEC.2, dated 4 October 2022), attached as annex 3 to Council decision EC-67/DEC.6, a national paper by China (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations) and a national paper by Japan (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations) on the overall progress of the destruction of chemical weapons abandoned by Japan on the territory of China have been circulated to the members of the Council.

Subitem 6(c): Elimination of the Syrian chemical weapons programme

- 6.5 Further to its decision at its Eighty-Third Session (EC-83/DEC.5, dated 11 November 2016), the Council decided to place “Elimination of the Syrian Chemical Weapons Programme” on the agenda of all future Council sessions until the Council determines that all elements of the Syrian chemical weapons programme have been eliminated.
- 6.6 The Council is **requested** to note reports by the Director-General reporting on progress in the elimination of the Syrian chemical weapons programme (EC-109/DG.2, dated 24 March 2025; EC-109/DG.3, dated 24 April 2025; and EC-109/DG.9, dated 23 May 2025).
- 6.7 The Council is **requested** to note a Note by the Director-General entitled “Report on the Work of the Declaration Assessment Team” (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations).
- 6.8 The Secretariat circulated a Note by the Secretariat entitled “Estimated Costs of OPCW Mandated Activities to Resolve the Remaining Issues Surrounding the Syrian Chemical Weapons Programme” (S/2397/2025, dated 29 April 2025).
- 6.9 The Secretariat provided a briefing to States Parties on 23 May 2025 on its activities related to the Syrian Arab Republic.

Subitem 6(d): Other verification-related issues

- 6.10 The Secretariat is expected to provide an update to the Council on its other verification-related activities.
- 6.11 Further to the decision of the Council at its Sixty-Sixth Session on the policy guidelines for determining the number of Article VI inspections (EC-66/DEC.10, dated 7 October 2011), the Council is **requested** to note a Note by the Director-General on the results of the thirteenth year of implementation of these policy guidelines (EC-109/DG.1, dated 20 March 2025).

Subitem 6(e): Addressing the threat from chemical weapons use

- 6.12 The Council is **requested** to note the regular report by the Director-General to the Council on progress made in the implementation of the decision of the Conference of the States Parties (the Conference) entitled “Addressing the Threat from Chemical Weapons Use” (C-SS-4/DEC.3, dated 27 June 2018) (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations).

Subitem 6(f): Timely submission of declarations under Article VI of the Chemical Weapons Convention

- 6.13 Further to a decision by the Council at its Fifty-First Session (EC-51/DEC.1, dated 27 November 2007), the Council is **requested** to note a status report by the Director-General on the timely submission by States Parties of declarations under Article VI of the Chemical Weapons Convention (the Convention) for the period 1 January to 31 May 2025 (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations).

Subitem 6(g): Article VII: briefings by the facilitator and by the Technical Secretariat

- 6.14 The Secretariat will make a presentation on the status of implementation of Article VII.

Subitem 6(h): The content of the Protection and Assistance Databank and its use

- 7.2 The Council is **requested** to consider a Note by the Director-General on lists of newly validated data on non-scheduled chemicals relevant to the Convention for approval by the Council for inclusion in the OCAD (EC-109/DG.6, dated 6 May 2025) and to adopt a draft decision on the matter (EC-109/DEC/CRP.3, dated 6 May 2025).
- 7.3 The Council is **requested** to consider a Note by the Director-General on lists of approved data recommended for removal from the OCAD (EC-109/DG.5, dated 6 May 2025) and to adopt a draft decision on the matter (EC-109/DEC/CRP.2 dated 6 May 2025).

- 20.1 In accordance with subparagraph 21(d) and paragraph 43 of Article VIII of the Convention, the Director-General of the Technical Secretariat of the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons shall be appointed by the Conference upon the recommendation of the Council for a term of four years, renewable for one further term, but not thereafter.
- 20.2 At its Twenty-Sixth Session, the Conference considered and adopted a decision renewing the appointment of the present Director-General for one further term of four years beginning on 25 July 2022 and ending on 24 July 2026 (C-26/DEC.9, dated 30 November 2021).
- 20.3 At the 108th Session of the Council, the Chairperson of the Council issued a Note entitled “Road Map for the Process of the Appointment of the Next Director-General in 2025” (EC-108/2, dated 7 February 2025).
- 20.4 At the same session, pursuant to Rule 48 of its Rules of Procedure, and considering that the Thirtieth Session will be the last regular session of the Conference before the expiry of the term of the present Director-General, the Council adopted a decision on the process for the appointment of the Director-General (EC-108/DEC.5, dated 6 March 2025).
- 20.5 In accordance with paragraph 2 of EC-108/DEC.5, on 10 March 2025 the Chairperson invited, on the Council’s behalf, States Parties to present their nominations of candidates by no later than 16 May 2025.
- 20.6 The Secretariat circulated to the members of the Council notes on the nomination of candidates for the appointment to the position of Director-General by Bosnia and Herzegovina (EC-109/S/1, dated 10 March 2025); Ecuador (EC-109/S/2, dated 11 March 2025); Switzerland (EC-109/S/3, dated 17 March 2025); Hungary (EC-109/S/4, dated 18 March 2025); Estonia (EC-109/S/5, dated 25 March 2025); Costa Rica (EC-109/S/6, dated 2 April 2025); Ghana (EC-109/S/7, dated 8 April 2025); Romania (EC-109/S/8, dated 29 April 2025); Botswana (EC-109/S/9, dated 7 May 2025); Tunisia (EC-109/S/10, dated 15 May 2025); and Nigeria (EC-109/S/11, dated 15 May 2025).

- 20.7 The Chairperson of the Council issued a note entitled “Report on the Status of the Process of the Appointment of the next Director-General in 2025” (this document will be assigned an official reference number when it is made available to delegations).
- 20.8 On 7 July 2025, the candidates are expected to make in-person presentations during an informal sitting of the Council attended by Council members and interested States Parties.
