STATEMENT BY THE ITALIAN AMBASSADOR HE AUGUSTO MASSARI AT THE 67th MEETING OF THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

Thank you Mr Chair, my congratulations on your election as chair of the Executive Council. I would also like to thank the Director General for his update.

Italy align itself with the EU statement delivered by the danish Ambassador.

Italy is following with close attention and concern the developments in the Middle East, including the latest events on Iranian territory.

Italy reaffirms its resolute commitment to full compliance with the Chemical Weapons Convention, the United Nations Charter and international law, which are the pillars of the rules-based multilateral order. Any action that could undermine these fundamental principles must be carefully assessed and transparently clarified within the competent international fora.

We strongly support the role of the OPCW as the guarantor of a world free of chemical weapons and its non-proliferation in any context, anytime and under any circumstances.

At the same time, it is necessary that all parties involved act with a sense of responsibility and restraint, avoiding further escalation, and that dialogue and diplomacy remain the central means of addressing tensions of this nature.
