NOTE BY THE TECHNICAL SECRETARIAT

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR THE TWENTY-FOURTH REGIONAL MEETING OF NATIONAL AUTHORITIES OF STATES PARTIES IN AFRICA MONROVIA, LIBERIA 9 – 11 JUNE 2026

1. The Technical Secretariat of the OPCW (the Secretariat) wishes to invite States Parties from Africa to nominate representatives to attend the Twenty-Fourth Regional Meeting of National Authorities of States Parties in Africa, which will be held in Monrovia, Liberia, from 9 to 11 June 2026.
2. This regional meeting of National Authorities will serve as a forum for States Parties to discuss needs, priorities, actions taken, and best practices in relation to the implementation of the Chemical Weapons Convention (the Convention) at the national, subregional, and regional level. Participants will also discuss the capacity-development support provided within the framework of the OPCW Programme to Strengthen Cooperation with Africa on the Chemical Weapons Convention (the Africa Programme).
3. The purpose of the meeting is to facilitate the exchange of information and views on:
 - (a) OPCW capacity-development activities in the Africa region, including an overview of the Africa Programme;
 - (b) tools available in support of the timely and accurate submission of declarations, as well as updated information about OPCW inspections;
 - (c) ways and means of strengthening regional and subregional networks and fostering enhanced collaboration among States Parties in attendance;
 - (d) strategy and policy-related developments at the OPCW, including on emerging technology initiatives and activities;
 - (e) developments related to the National Implementation Framework, the Mentorship/Partnership Programme for National Authorities, and preliminary assessment post-training action plans for customs capacity-development courses; and
 - (f) priorities and activities under the seventh phase of the Africa Programme (2026 – 2028).



4. The expected results of the meeting are to provide participants with:
 - (a) relevant and up-to-date information on the status of implementation of the Convention in the region;
 - (b) an enhanced understanding of follow-up actions and best practices that could be considered to step up implementation of the Convention in their respective States Parties;
 - (c) strengthened regional and subregional networks and opportunities for enhanced collaboration among States Parties in attendance;
 - (d) an increased awareness of strategy and policy-related developments at the OPCW, including on emerging technology initiatives and activities;
 - (e) an enhanced understanding of specific issues related to Articles VI, VII, X, and XI of the Convention and the respective support provided by the Secretariat; and
 - (f) an improved understanding of the seventh phase of the Africa Programme and a strengthened commitment to expedite its implementation.
5. The provisional programme for the regional meeting is included as the Annex to this Note.
6. The National Authority of each State Party in the region is requested to nominate one delegate for participation in the regional meeting. The Secretariat will sponsor one participant per State Party. The sponsorship will cover the costs of travel, hotel accommodation, meals, and medical insurance, in addition to a limited subsistence allowance to cover terminal and sundry expenses. States Parties and National Authorities are strongly encouraged to support and endorse the applications or nominations of suitable women candidates for this event.
7. Sponsored participants who do not intend to use the accommodation arranged by the Secretariat are requested to indicate this no later than four weeks prior to the event in order to prevent the Secretariat from incurring hotel cancellation fees. In any case, the Secretariat will not cover the costs of any accommodation that it has not arranged.
8. The meeting will be conducted in English and in French, with interpretation services available. Participants are therefore expected to have a good oral and written command of either English or French.
9. Interested National Authority representatives are invited to register **before 19 March 2026** through Eventus, the OPCW event management system (<https://eventus.opcw.org/>). Each application must be endorsed digitally on the Eventus platform by the respective National Authority **no later than 23 March 2026**.
10. All nominated persons must hold passports with at least six months of validity beyond the anticipated date of travel to Liberia, and copies of the passports must be uploaded to the Eventus platform as part of the application process.

11. National Authorities that wish for their nominee(s) to make a presentation at the meeting should inform the Secretariat about the presentation's specific thematic area. Ideally, presentations should be limited to seven minutes and highlight best practices, as well as challenges encountered in relation to implementation of the Convention. In addition, specific actions taken by a State Party as a result of attending or participating in the Secretariat's capacity-development events (in particular those within the framework of the Africa Programme) should be brought to the attention of the meeting participants.
12. Furthermore, National Authorities may express their interest in bilateral consultations with the Secretariat staff. Information on national presentations and bilateral consultations should be conveyed by the respective nominee(s) to Mr Solomon Haile, the Senior Programme Officer in charge of organising the regional meeting.
