REPORT BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

FINANCIAL, ADMINISTRATIVE, AND PROGRAMME AND BUDGET IMPLICATIONS OF THE REPORT OF THE OPCW-UNITED NATIONS JOINT INVESTIGATIVE MECHANISM ON THE USE OF CHEMICAL WEAPONS BY THE SYRIAN ARAB REPUBLIC AND A NON-STATE ACTOR

- 1. In accordance with Rule 34 of the Rules of Procedure of the Executive Council, the Director-General herewith submits the financial, administrative, and programme and budget implications of draft decision EC-M-56/DEC/CRP.2/Rev.2 (dated 22 November 2017) on the report of the OPCW-United Nations Joint Investigative Mechanism on the use of chemical weapons by the Syrian Arab Republic and a non-State actor.
- 2. It should be noted that the "budgetary impact" figures provided in the table below represent the forecast deployments of the OPCW Fact-Finding Mission in Syria (FFM) or the Declaration Assessment Team (DAT). The calculations are based on the previous deployment costs of a 10-day mission (EUR 43,000).
- 3. It should also be noted that the costs of the estimated remaining work to preserve FFM and DAT data, as referred to in paragraph 10 of EC-M-56/DEC/CRP.2/Rev.2, would amount to EUR 56,000.
