NOTE BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

CW CHIEF INSTRUCTOR TRAINING PROGRAMME (CITPRO), SPIEZ, SWITZERLAND, 23 - 27 NOVEMBER 1998

- 1. On behalf of the Government of Switzerland and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons, the Director-General wishes to invite Member States of the OPCW to nominate participants for a training course on CW protection, which will be held at the NC Training Centre in Spiez, Switzerland, from 23 to 27 November 1998.
- 2. The course is related to the offer made by Switzerland under Article X of the Chemical Weapons Convention (CWC) in relation to assistance and protection against chemical weapons, and will be jointly organised by the Government of Switzerland and the OPCW Secretariat. The course will provide training in civil CW protection, detection and decontamination for up to 40 chief instructors from Member States of the OPCW.
- 3. The course will provide basic training for specialists and experts who are, or will be associated with CW protection training of civilians in their home countries. Its main purpose is to assist OPCW Member States in their efforts to establish a basic CW protection capability that will directly benefit the civilian population. The course draws on the extensive experience of Switzerland in the field of civilian CW protection. Due to the objective of the course and its technical nature, the candidates will be carefully selected. Applicants from Member States which do not yet have civilian CW protection capabilities will be particularly welcome. Participants should have a basic technical background, as well as good English language skills. They should also be physically fit and able to wear individual protective gear during some practical sessions of the course. Some practical experience with military or civil CW protection would be desirable.
- 4. It is anticipated that participants will arrive on Sunday 22 November and depart on Saturday 28 November 1998. Participants are requested to obtain any necessary visas before travelling to Switzerland. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor a limited number of candidates nominated by the Member States of the OPCW, to cover their travel costs. When proposing candidates for the course, Member States should

specify whether such sponsorship is a precondition for their participation. The course materials, as well as accommodation and all meals during the course, will be provided by the Swiss Government free of charge. Further details regarding accommodation, the course venue and transportation will be issued to the participants at a later date.

- 5. Interested Member States are invited to complete the nomination form shown in annex 1 to this Note, giving the full name and address (including fax and telephone numbers, and e-mail address, if available) of each participant, together with his or her affiliation, and area(s) of expertise. The completed nomination form, together with a brief biography of each nominee, should be submitted to the Emergency Assistance Branch, International Cooperation and Assistance Division (ICA) as soon as possible, but no later than 12 October 1998, to allow sufficient time for the OPCW Secretariat and the Swiss authorities to make the necessary arrangements. In the meantime, Member States are requested to inform the ICA of any administrative or other problems that may arise in relation to the attendance of any nominee.
- 6. A tentative schedule for the training course is attached as annex 2 to this Note. Further details of the arrangements will be issued as soon as the ICA receives confirmation from the participants that they will be attending the course.
