NOTE BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

COMPOSITION OF THE SCIENTIFIC ADVISORY BOARD 2001 - 2004

- 1. In accordance with the terms of reference of the Scientific Advisory Board (C-II/DEC.10, dated 5 December 1997), board members serve a term of three years. Their term of office can be extended once. The original members of the Scientific Advisory Board were appointed by the Director-General in July 1998 (see S/62/98, dated 22 July 1998). Their first term of office consequently ended in July 2001.
- 2. When submitting the fourth report of the Scientific Advisory Board to Member States in March 2001, the Director-General made known his intention, "in the interest of continuity, and in particular given that the preparations for the 2003 Review Conference will require a significant contribution by the Board, … to offer a second term to all those members of the Board who are willing to continue" (subparagraph 3.3 of EC-XXIV/DG.2, dated 9 March 2001).
- 3. Two board members had indicated their intention not to serve a second term, and the Director-General invited Member States to submit nominations to fill these impending vacancies (subparagraph 3.4 of the same document). The Director-General wishes to take this opportunity to express his gratitude and appreciation to the two former board members, Dr Maria Consuelo Lopez-Zumel of Spain and Professor Shintaro Furusaki of Japan, for their valuable contributions to the work of the board.
- 4. By July 2001, the Director-General had received two nominations, both of highly suitable candidates, from the Governments of Japan and the Czech Republic respectively. In the absence of any further nominations, and given the well-established scientific credentials of the above-mentioned two nominees in areas relevant to the OPCW and the work of the Scientific Advisory Board, the Director-General has decided to offer both candidates a seat on the Scientific Advisory Board. At the same time, he offered reappointments to those board members who had indicated that they were willing to serve a second term.
- 5. The Director-General has now received letters of acceptance from all experts to whom he had offered a seat on the board. Through the annex to this Note, he wishes to inform Member States of the composition of the Scientific Advisory Board for the three-year period July 2001 to July 2004. Ralf Trapp will continue to serve as the Secretary of the board.
