NOTE BY THE TECHNICAL SECRETARIAT

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR A REGIONAL MEETING OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NATIONAL AUTHORITIES AND PARLIAMENTS IN LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA 22 AND 23 JULY 2008

- 1. The Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat") and the National Authority of Argentina wish to invite the personnel of National Authorities to submit nominations for a regional meeting of representatives of National Authorities and parliaments in Latin America and the Caribbean, which will be held in Buenos Aires, Argentina, on 22 and 23 July 2008.
- 2. The Secretariat seeks nominations in two categories. The meeting is designed, on the one hand, as a forum for personnel from National Authorities who are involved daily with issues surrounding the national implementation of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Convention"). Nominees in this category should actually be involved in implementing the Convention at the national level.
- 3. The Secretariat also seeks nominations from representatives of national parliaments in the region who are members of relevant parliamentary committees or who have been or will be directly involved in the adoption of national implementing legislation. Participants with this background would discuss the role parliaments can play in the implementation of the Convention and consider ways of increasing awareness of the Convention among their fellow parliamentarians, and thus of enhancing their involvement in national implementation.
- 4. The overall objective of the meeting is to promote a greater understanding of the Convention on the part of parliamentarians who will be involved in the approval of national implementing legislation. The specific aims of the meeting are to:
 - (a) promote a greater understanding on the part of parliamentarians of the obligations States Parties have under the Convention;
 - (b) enhance awareness of the need for States Parties to adopt comprehensive implementing legislation in order to fulfil those obligations;

- (c) identify common implementation problems and draw up guidelines on how they can be resolved through such legislation; and
- (d) contribute to greater self-sufficiency as regards national-implementation capacities.
- 5. In order for the Convention to be fully implemented, National Authorities and Parliaments need to work closely together. The meeting will thus include a thematic segment that will be devoted to fostering such partnerships and to helping achieve the objectives both of the plan of action regarding the implementation of Article VII obligations, which was adopted by the Conference of the States Parties at its Eighth Session (C-8/DEC.16, dated 24 October 2003), and of the decisions on follow-up to it (C-10/DEC.16, dated 11 November 2005; C-11/DEC.4, dated 6 December 2006; and C-12/DEC.9 dated 9 November 2007).
- 6. All activities during the meeting will be conducted in Spanish, and English-language interpretation services will be provided. All participants are therefore expected to have a good command of either English or Spanish.
- 7. As at the date of this Note, 32% of States Parties had yet to inform the OPCW of the legislative and administrative measures they had taken to implement the Convention, in accordance with Article VII, paragraph 5, of the Convention. In some cases, delays have been caused by the length of time it takes for draft implementing legislation to be reviewed and approved. Parliaments can play an important role in expediting this process.
- 8. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor the attendance at the meeting of a limited number of participants. Each nomination should specify whether sponsorship is a condition of the nominee's participation. For sponsored participants, the Secretariat will cover the costs of travel, meals, and medical insurance, and will provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover sundry expenses. It will also arrange and pay for accommodation for these participants, unless the participant requests otherwise. Sponsored participants who do not intend to use the accommodation provided by the Secretariat are requested to indicate that as soon as possible, so that it does not incur hotel cancellation fees. The daily subsistence allowance will remain unchanged for those sponsored participants who opt to make their own accommodation arrangements.
- 9. When making travel arrangements for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. It will purchase tickets and send them to participants. Participants will be allowed to purchase tickets locally only if this leads to further savings for the Secretariat and if the Secretariat authorises it. In order for the Secretariat to keep costs to a minimum, sponsored participants are expected to arrive no earlier than Monday, 21 July 2008, and to depart no later than Thursday, 24 July 2008. The Secretariat's agreement is required for any changes to the arrival and departure dates for sponsored participants. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the meeting or that result from unauthorised changes to travel arrangements. Sponsored participants shall bear all costs resulting from any changes

they make once the Secretariat has purchased tickets. Participants who have not been sponsored are requested to make their own travel and accommodation arrangements, although the Secretariat can, if necessary, arrange accommodation at reduced rates.

- 10. Participants are requested to obtain any necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to Argentina. Participants who will require an entry visa are advised to contact the nearest diplomatic mission of Argentina as soon as possible.
- 11. As noted above, nominations are invited both from the staff of National Authorities and from representatives of national parliaments in the region. For each nominee, the National Authority should complete the nomination form that is included as Annex 2 to this Note, making sure in particular to provide all the contact details requested. Please be advised that participants must present an OPCW acceptance letter in order to register at the meeting.
