NOTE BY THE TECHNICAL SECRETARIAT

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR AN ASSISTANCE-AND-PROTECTION COURSE BEIJING, THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA 19 – 23 JULY 2010

- 1. On behalf of the Government of the People's Republic of China and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW), the Director-General is pleased to invite States Parties to nominate candidates to participate in an international basic course on assistance and protection, which will take place in Beijing, the People's Republic of China, from 19 to 23 July 2010.
- 2. The course, which will be jointly organised by the Government of the People's Republic of China and the Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat"), will provide training to up to 20 participants in planning for and building a support team in civil protection, civil defence, and decontamination operations in contaminated areas, as well as in appropriate responses and countermeasures in the event of incidents involving chemical-warfare agents. It will provide training to participants in establishing a basic capability in protection from chemical weapons, which will directly benefit their civilian populations.
- 3. The course will offer a basic introduction to the use of protective equipment, and to monitoring, detection, and decontamination techniques. Participants completing the course will acquire a general knowledge of chemical-warfare agents, individual protective equipment, detection and decontamination equipment, as well as an understanding of how all of the equipment is to be used. The course will also facilitate the exchange of information and experiences regarding the implementation of Article X of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Convention"), and will provide a forum for the discussion of future cooperation among participating Member States and of what further offers they might make to the OPCW under Article X.
- 4. Given the purpose of the course and its technical nature, candidates will be carefully selected, and should have experience with assistance and protection against chemical weapons. Preference will be given to officers from emergency-response units involved in civilian protection. In addition, participants should be physically fit and able to wear individual protective gear for several hours at a time during practical sessions of the course. Some practical experience with protective equipment is desirable.

- 5. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor the participation of a limited number of participants. Each nomination should specify whether sponsorship is a condition of the nominee's participation. For sponsored participants, the Secretariat will cover the costs of travel, accommodation, meals, and medical insurance, and will provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover sundry expenses. The course materials and local transport during the course will be provided by the National Authority of the People's Republic of China, represented by the Institute of Chemical Defence, at no cost to the participants. Further details regarding accommodation, the course venue, and transport will be issued to all confirmed participants at a later date.
- 6. When making travel arrangements for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. Participants will be allowed to purchase tickets locally only if this leads to further savings for the Secretariat, and if the Secretariat authorises it. In order for the Secretariat to keep costs to a minimum, sponsored participants are expected to arrive **no earlier than Sunday**, **18 July 2010**, and to depart **no later than Saturday**, **24 July 2010**. The Secretariat's approval is required for any changes to the arrival and departure dates of sponsored participants. The Secretariat and the National Authority of the People's Republic of China will not cover expenses unrelated to the course or that result from unauthorised changes to travel arrangements. Sponsored participants shall bear all costs resulting from changes they make, including cancellations, once the Secretariat has purchased their tickets. Participants who have not been sponsored are requested to make their own travel arrangements and to inform the Secretariat accordingly.
- 7. All activities during the meeting will be conducted in English, and no interpretation services of any kind will be provided. Participants are therefore expected to have a good written and oral command of the English language.
- 8. Participants are requested to obtain all necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to the People's Republic of China.
- 9. Interested applicants are invited to complete the nomination form that is included as Annex 2 to this Note, making sure in particular to provide all contact details it requests. Completed forms should be sent, along with a brief curriculum vitae, to the Director, International Cooperation and Assistance Division, OPCW, Johan de Wittlaan 32, 2517 JR The Hague, the Netherlands. Please be advised that participants must present an OPCW acceptance letter in order to register for the course. Only those nominees selected for participation will be contacted two weeks after the deadline for submissions has passed.
