NOTE BY THE TECHNICAL SECRETARIAT

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR THE TWELFTH ANNUAL MEETING OF NATIONAL AUTHORITIES THE HAGUE, THE NETHERLANDS 26 – 28 NOVEMBER 2010

- 1. The Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat") wishes to invite National Authorities to submit nominations for the Twelfth Annual Meeting of National Authorities, which will be held at OPCW Headquarters in The Hague from 26 to 28 November 2010, just prior to the Fifteenth Session of the Conference of the States Parties (hereinafter "the Conference").
- 2. The meeting is designed as a forum for personnel from National Authorities who are involved daily with issues surrounding the national implementation of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Convention").
- 3. Each year, the meeting of National Authorities includes a thematic segment. This year, the thematic segment, which will take place on 26 November 2010, will consist in "A Review of the Impact of the Implementation Support and Capacity-Building Activities of the OPCW", and will focus on the following:
 - (a) the evaluation and analysis of feedback received from participants attending OPCW implementation support and capacity-building activities; and
 - (b) the experiences of States Parties that have received implementation and capacity-building support from the OPCW, and the lessons learned.

4. The objectives are:

- (a) to work with States Parties to review and better understand their own efforts and those of the Secretariat to increase their national capacity to comply with their obligations under the Convention;
- (b) to facilitate the exchange of information and experiences regarding the implementation of the Convention, with a view to improving and focusing such efforts in the future;

- (c) to promote cooperation among National Authorities at the regional and subregional levels;
- (d) to identify implementation problems and to facilitate their resolution through cooperation between the States Parties and the Secretariat;
- (e) to enhance awareness of activities relating to international cooperation under the Convention; and
- (f) to build upon the outcomes of the National Authorities meeting in order for the Secretariat to design better implementation-support and capacity-building programmes in the future.
- 5. National Authorities are invited to nominate representatives who have been or will be directly involved in the implementation of the Convention, particularly in its day-to-day activities. Representatives of stakeholders of the National Authorities involved with activities described in paragraph 4 above are also invited to attend.
- 6. During the thematic segment on 26 November 2010, an overview will be provided of International Cooperation and Assistance Division (ICA) implementation and capacity-building activities since entry into force (EIF) of the Convention, and round-table discussions on the evaluation and analysis of feedback received from the participants attending ICA activities will take place.
- 7. On 27 November 2010, National Authorities will be provided with information on the issues to be discussed during the Conference when it meets for its Fifteenth Session (between 29 November and 3 December 2010) and on the progress made in implementing Article VII of the Convention. On 27 November, National Authorities will also have the opportunity to meet in their respective regional groups to identify key areas for the Secretariat to focus on in regard to implementation-support programmes in 2011.
- 8. The presence in The Hague of the representatives of so many National Authorities, in conjunction with the Fifteenth Session of the Conference, will provide a unique opportunity for these representatives to meet with Secretariat officials to discuss issues of specific interest to individual States Parties; the morning of 28 November 2010 will be reserved for this purpose. Interested National Authorities are therefore requested to tick (√) the appropriate box(es) on the nomination form in order to inform the Secretariat beforehand of the particular national-implementation issues they would like to discuss, thus enabling the appropriate Secretariat officials to be prepared for the relevant consultations. During the meeting, the Secretariat may also invite participants to discuss implementation issues on a bilateral basis. National Authorities that wish to discuss draft legislation are encouraged to submit drafts in advance and to contact the Office of the Legal Adviser (LAO) before the meeting to discuss their specific needs. - 9. The programme for the meeting is attached as Annex 1 to this Note.

- 10. Interpretation services will be provided in all the official languages of the OPCW only on 26 and 27 November 2010. No interpretation services will be available during the regional group meetings during the afternoon of 27 November or during the bilateral consultations on the morning of 28 November.
- 11. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor the participation of a limited number of representatives from National Authorities. Each nomination should specify whether sponsorship is a condition of the nominee's participation. For sponsored participants, the Secretariat will cover the costs of travel, meals, accommodation, and medical insurance and will provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover sundry expenses. Sponsored participants who do not intend to use the accommodation provided by the Secretariat are requested to indicate that as soon as possible, so that the Secretariat does not incur hotel cancellation fees. In any case, the Secretariat will not cover the costs of any accommodation it has not arranged.
- 12. When making travel arrangements for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. It will purchase tickets and send them to participants. Participants will be allowed to purchase tickets locally only if this leads to further savings for the Secretariat and if the Secretariat authorises it. In order for the Secretariat to keep costs to a minimum, sponsored participants are expected to arrive **no earlier than Thursday**, 25 November 2010, and to depart **no later than Monday**, 29 November 2010. Participants wishing to stay in The Hague in order to participate in the Fifteenth Session of the Conference must inform the Secretariat of their intended return date, so that appropriate arrangements can be made. Please note that any additional overnight stays by sponsored participants in connection with the Fifteenth Session of the Conference will be at their own expense.
- 13. The agreement of the Secretariat is required for any changes to the arrival and departure dates of sponsored participants. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the meeting or that result from changes in travel arrangements it has not authorised. Sponsored participants shall bear all costs resulting from changes that they make, including cancellations, once the Secretariat has purchased the tickets. Participants who have not been sponsored are requested to make their own travel and accommodation arrangements, although the Secretariat can, if necessary, arrange accommodation at reduced rates.
- 14. Participants are requested to obtain any necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to the Netherlands. Participants requiring an entry visa for the Netherlands are advised to contact the nearest diplomatic mission of the Netherlands as soon as possible. Participants who need further assistance may contact the Protocol and Visa Branch of the Secretariat by phone at +31 (0)70 416 3777 or by fax at +31 (0)70 306 3890.
- 15. Interested National Authorities are invited to complete a separate nomination form (attached as Annex 2 to this Note) for each nominee, making sure in particular to provide all the contact details it requests. nomination forms must be received by the Secretariat **no later than Friday, 1 October 2010**. Any applications received after 1 October 2010 will not be considered for sponsorship. It should also be noted that participants must present an OPCW acceptance letter in order to register at the meeting.
