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NOTE BY THE TECHNICAL SECRETARIAT

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS TO THE SCIENTIFIC ADVISORY BOARD

1. The Technical Secretariat (hereinafter “the Secretariat”) wishes to inform States Parties that three members of the Scientific Advisory Board (SAB) will complete their second term during 2013. The list of those SAB members whose terms of office are due to finish in 2013 appears in Annex 1 to this Note. A further five members will be completing their first term during 2013.
2. In light of the above, the Secretariat invites States Parties to nominate one or more qualified experts, to be appointed by the Director-General after a selection process, to serve on the SAB. The terms of reference of the SAB, which are annexed to a decision of the Conference of the States Parties at its Second Session (C-II/DEC.10/Rev.1, dated 2 December 2004), stipulate in paragraph 6 that “[t]he term of office of members of the Board shall be three years. A Board member may serve for two consecutive terms”.
3. With reference to paragraph 4 of the aforementioned terms of reference, nominees to be proposed should be eminent persons active at such institutions as research institutions, universities, chemical-industry companies, and defence and military organisations, who will be selected on the basis of their expertise in one or more of the particular scientific fields relevant to the implementation of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter “the Convention”). Paragraph 4 further stipulates that “preference shall be given to persons who are knowledgeable about the relevant scientific and technological developments, and who are familiar with the implementation of the Convention. Efforts shall be made to maintain a balance between the areas of research, development and applications”.
4. Nominees should be proposed on the basis of their qualifications and experience, with States Parties taking into account their publications, scientific, academic or professional activities, distinctions, and international experience.
5. When selecting candidates for nomination, States Parties should also take into consideration the fact that science and technology are advancing rapidly in areas that are relevant to the Convention. Accordingly, and with reference to paragraph 4 of EC-38/DG.18, dated 16 September 2004, States Parties may wish to nominate candidates with backgrounds in areas of emerging or increasing relevance to the implementation of the Convention, such as practical applications in the chemical industry, life-sciences disciplines, and information technology.



6. Nominees should be ready to make substantive contributions at SAB meetings, during the intersessional periods, and at other relevant science-and-technology events. Each nominee is requested to submit a written statement describing how he/she intends to have a substantial impact on the work of the SAB and the OPCW.
7. The Secretariat requests States Parties to submit nominations, using the attached nomination form (Annex 2), **by 1 June 2013**. The form should be accompanied by the curriculum vitae of the nominee and by the written statement (up to 500 words) mentioned in paragraph 6 above.
