# NOTE BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

## CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR THE THIRD REGIONAL ADVANCED ASSISTANCE-AND-PROTECTION COURSE ON CHEMICAL-EMERGENCY RESPONSE BUENOS AIRES, ARGENTINA 19-24 MAY 2014

- 1. On behalf of the Government of Argentina and the OPCW, the Director-General wishes to invite Member States in the Latin American and Caribbean region to nominate participants for the third advanced regional assistance-and-protection course on Chemical-Emergency Response for States Parties in the Latin America and Caribbean region, which will take place in Buenos Aires, Argentina, from 19 to 24 May 2014.
- 2. The course is related to assistance and protection against chemical weapons under Article X of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Convention"), and will be jointly organised by the Government of Argentina and the Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat").
- 3. The course objectives are to:
  - (a) provide advanced training on the proper use of individual and collective protective equipment, and the monitoring, detection, sampling, and decontamination techniques used in different scenarios, by means of field exercises with chemical-warfare agents;
  - (b) provide training on appropriate responses and countermeasures in complex emergency operations, and on rescue techniques to be used in incidents involving chemical-warfare agents;
  - (c) facilitate the exchange of information and experience regarding the implementation of Article X of the Convention; and
  - (d) provide a forum to discuss future cooperation among participating Member States, as well as what further offers Member States might make to the OPCW under Article X.

The provisional programme for the course is set out in Annex 1 to this Note.

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- 4. Given the purpose of the course, and its technical nature, applicants will be carefully selected. They should have a solid background in the chemistry associated with protection against chemical weapons. They should also belong to national emergency-response agencies involved in dealing with chemical-related incidents. It is of particular importance for the success of the training that participants be physically fit and able to wear protective gear for several hours during the practical sessions of the course.
- 5. This advanced course is part of a pilot project that is being implemented for the Latin America and Caribbean region, which starts with a basic course in Santiago de Chile in March. Participants on that basic course are strongly encouraged to apply for this course and will be given preference.
- 6. Other applicants wishing to be accepted on this course should have taken one or more OPCW basic courses on assistance and protection against chemical weapons and/or participated in OPCW protective capacity-building training provided by the Secretariat.
- 7. The course will be conducted in Spanish, and no interpretation services will be provided. Participants are therefore expected to have a good command of both spoken and written Spanish.
- 8. Only applicants supported by their National Authority and/or their Permanent Representation to the OPCW will be considered.
- 9. Participants are requested to obtain all necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to Argentina.
- 10. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor the participation of a limited number of participants. Applicants should specify whether sponsorship is a condition of the nominee's participation. For sponsored participants, the Secretariat will cover the costs of travel, medical insurance, accommodation, and meals, and will also provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover sundry expenses.
- 11. Course materials, equipment, and local transport during the course will be provided by the Government of Argentina, at no cost to participants or to the OPCW.
- 12. When making travel arrangements for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. Participants will be allowed to purchase tickets locally only if this leads to further savings for the Secretariat, and if the Secretariat authorises it in advance.
- 13. To keep costs to a minimum, sponsored participants are expected to arrive no earlier than **Sunday**, **18 May 2014**, and to depart no later than **Sunday 25 May 2014**. The Secretariat's approval is required for any changes to the arrival or departure dates of sponsored participants. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the course, or that result from unauthorised changes to travel arrangements. Sponsored participants shall bear all the costs resulting from any changes they make, including cancellations, once the Secretariat has purchased their tickets. Participants who will attend the course on a non-sponsored basis are requested to make their own travel arrangements and to inform the Secretariat accordingly.

- 14. Further details regarding accommodation, the course venue, and transport will be communicated to participants in due course.
- 15. Interested applicants are invited to register their nomination form, together with a brief curriculum vitae, via the OPCW website at http://www.opcw.org/events. Please, note that all the required questions (indicated by \*) need to be answered, otherwise the application cannot be considered.
- 16. Interested applicants who, for technical reasons, are unable to submit an application online at http://www.opcw.org/events, are requested to send their nomination form (Annex 2 to this Note) and their curriculum vitae by email to EmergAssistBr@opcw.org.
