NOTE BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR A COURSE ON MEDICAL ASPECTS OF ASSISTANCE AND PROTECTION AGAINST CHEMICAL WEAPONS KAUNAS, LITHUANIA 1 – 5 JUNE 2015

- 1. On behalf of the Government of Lithuania and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW), the Director-General wishes to invite Member States to nominate participants for a course on medical aspects of assistance and protection against chemical-warfare agents, which will be held in Kaunas, Lithuania, from 1 to 5 June 2015.
- 2. The course is related to assistance and protection against chemical weapons under Article X of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Convention"), and will be jointly organised by the Government of Lithuania and the Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat").
- 3. The course has been designed primarily for specialised personnel such as physicians, paramedics, actors from the emergency services, and first responders confronted with incidents involving toxic chemicals, including chemical warfare agents. The course will be particularly valuable for stakeholders who work in the provision of medical countermeasures to chemical emergencies and who have a background in the medical aspects of emergency response to incidents involving toxic chemicals and chemical warfare agents.
- 4. The course will address matters related to protection during chemical emergencies, medical management of chemical casualties, psychological preparation of first responders, medical response and rehabilitation of victims of toxic chemicals and chemical weapons, and hospital emergency plan, amongst others.
- 5. The course, which will include theoretical lectures, demonstration sessions and a table-top exercise focused on the mitigation of chemical incidents, will also facilitate the exchange of information and experiences regarding medical assistance and protection practices to victims of this type of incident, in line with the provisions of Article X of the Convention. The provisional programme for the course is included as Annex 1 to this Note.
- 6. Given the purpose of the course and its medical focus and technical nature, candidates will be carefully selected and should have a solid background in emergency medicine, toxicology, or health care associated with protection against chemical weapons and

- other toxic chemicals. They should belong to national emergency-response agencies and other institutions involved in dealing with chemical-related incidents.
- 7. All activities during the course will be conducted in English, and no interpretation services of any kind will be provided. Participants are therefore expected to have a good written and oral command of English.
- 8. Participants are requested to obtain all necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to Lithuania.
- 9. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor the participation of a limited number of participants. Each nomination should specify whether sponsorship is a condition of the nominee's participation. For sponsored participants, the Secretariat will cover the costs of travel, medical insurance, accommodation and meals, and will provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover sundry expenses. Further details regarding accommodation, the course venue, and transport will be issued to all confirmed participants at a later date.
- 10. When making travel arrangements for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. Participants will be allowed to purchase tickets locally only if this leads to further savings for the Secretariat and if the Secretariat authorises it. In order for the Secretariat to keep costs to a minimum, sponsored participants are expected to arrive no earlier than Sunday, 31 May 2015, and to depart no later than Saturday, 6 June 2015. The Secretariat's approval is required for any changes to the arrival and departure dates of sponsored participants. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the course or that result from unauthorised changes to travel arrangements. Sponsored participants shall bear all costs resulting from changes they make, including cancellations, once the Secretariat has purchased their tickets.
- 11. Interested applicants are invited to complete the nomination form that is included as Annex 2 to this Note, making sure in particular to provide all contact details, including an email address. Completed forms should be sent, along with endorsement information from the National Authority or Permanent Representation and with a brief curriculum vitae, to the Director, International Cooperation and Assistance Division, OPCW, Johan de Wittlaan 32, 2517 JR The Hague, the Netherlands. Please be advised that participants must present an OPCW acceptance letter in order to be able to register for the course.
