#### NOTE BY THE DIRECTOR-GENERAL

# CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR A TRAINING COURSE ON CHEMICAL EMERGENCY RESPONSE FOR POLICE OFFICERS FROM STATES PARTIES IN LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN BOGOTÁ, COLOMBIA 23 – 27 JULY 2018

- 1. On behalf of Colombia and the Organisation for the Prohibition of Chemical Weapons (OPCW), the Director-General wishes to invite States Parties from the Latin America and Caribbean (GRULAC) region to nominate qualifying representatives to participate in a regional training course on chemical emergency response aimed at first responders from police and law enforcement authorities, which will take place from 23 to 27 July 2018 in Bogotá, Colombia.
- 2. The course will be jointly organised by the Government of Colombia and the Technical Secretariat (hereinafter "the Secretariat"). It will provide training to up to 20 participants in aspects related to response to attacks with chemical warfare agents and incidents with toxic industrial chemicals under the provisions of Article X of the Chemical Weapons Convention (hereinafter "the Convention").
- 3. The course will offer an introduction to basic toxicology, the types and uses of individual protective equipment, reconnaissance, detection, decontamination, forensics, and other topics related to the investigation of a contaminated crime scene. It will also cover elements related to risk assessment, prevention, and response to chemical emergencies. The course is also aimed at facilitating the exchange of information and fostering networking among the participants, with a view to enhancing the implementation of Article X of the Convention in the GRULAC region.
- 4. Candidates for this course should preferably belong to institutions such as police and other national law enforcement bodies from GRULAC States Parties that could be acting as first responders when facing such situations. Consequently, participants will be carefully selected in accordance with their professional functions. Participants should also be physically fit and able to wear individual protective gear during practical sessions of the course.
- 5. Endorsement by the National Authority is a prerequisite for a candidate being considered in the selection process.
- 6. The Secretariat expects to be able to sponsor a maximum of 20 participants. When proposing candidates for the course, Member States should specify whether such sponsorship is a condition of their participation. For sponsored participants, the

Secretariat will cover the cost of travel, accommodation, transfers (airport/hotel/airport), medical insurance, meals (lunch), and will provide a limited subsistence allowance to cover sundry expenses.

- 7. Further details regarding accommodation, the course venue, transport, and the final programme will be issued to participants in due course.
- 8. When making travel arrangements for sponsored participants, the Secretariat will seek the most economical options. Sponsored participants are encouraged to use the tickets provided by the Secretariat. Participants are expected to arrive no earlier than Sunday, 22 July 2018 and to depart no later than Saturday, 28 July 2018. The Secretariat's approval is required for any changes to the arrival and departure dates of sponsored participants. The Secretariat will not cover expenses unrelated to the course or that result from unauthorised changes to travel arrangements. Sponsored participants shall bear all costs resulting from changes they make, including cancellations, once the Secretariat has purchased their tickets.
- 9. Participants are requested to obtain all necessary visas (including transit visas) before travelling to Colombia.
- 10. The course will be presented in Spanish and participants are required to have a good working knowledge of Spanish, both written and oral. No interpretation services will be provided in this course.
- 11. Interested candidates are invited to complete the nomination form that is included as Annex 2 to this Note, giving each nominee's full name, passport details and address, fax and telephone numbers, email address, current functions and area(s) of expertise. The completed nomination form, together with a brief curriculum vitae for each nominee, should be sent to the Director, International Cooperation and Assistance Division, c/o Assistance and Protection Branch, OPCW, Johan de Wittlaan 32, 2517 JR The Hague, the Netherlands.
